JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States limiting the period of time United States Senators and Representatives may serve.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*
5 *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*
6 *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*

1 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
2 States:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “SECTION 1. No person may serve in Congress more
5 than 2 full terms as a Senator. No person may serve in
6 Congress more than 3 full terms as a Representative.

7 “SECTION 2. Service as a Senator or Representative
8 before this article takes effect shall not be taken into ac-
9 count in determining service under section 1.”.
