JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States establishing English as the official language of the United States.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "Article—
- 4 "Section 1. The English language shall be the offi-
- 5 cial language of the United States. As the official lan-
- 6 guage, the English language shall be used for all public
- 7 acts including every order, resolution, vote or election, and
- 8 for all records and judicial proceedings of the Government
- 9 of the United States and the governments of the several
- 10 States.
- 11 "Section 2. The Congress and the States shall en-
- 12 force this article by appropriate legislation.".
