- Whereas it is vital to unify small-town residents in the process of revitalizing their own small town and reinvigorating small-town life; and
- Whereas it is fitting that official recognition be given to the importance of small towns and a day set aside for activities that are most commonly associated with small towns, such as town festivals, family picnics, baseball games, et cetera: Now, therefore, be it

  - 3 That the President hereby is authorized and requested to
  - 4 issue a proclamation designating Sunday, August 1, 1993
  - 5 as Small-Town Sunday.
