## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to voluntary school prayer.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled

3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-

4 lowing article is hereby proposed as an amendment to the

5 Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to

- 6 all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution if rati-
- 7 fied by the legislatures of at least three-fourths of the sev-
- 8 eral States within seven years from the date of its proposal
- 9 to the States by the Congress:

## "ARTICLE —

2 "Nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to
3 prohibit individual or group prayer in public schools or
4 other public institutions. No person shall be required by
5 the United States or by any State to participate in prayer.
6 Neither the United States nor any State shall prescribe
7 the content of any such prayer."
