Mr. HILLIARD introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to
the Committee on Post Office and Civil Service

JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating April 29, 1994, as “Davey Allison Remembrance
Day”.

Whereas the Nation wishes to honor the memory of one of
the Nation’s most promising young NASCAR drivers,
Davey Allison of Hueytown, Alabama;

Whereas Davey Allison, in his Ford Thunderbird, was one of
the finest drivers on the Winston Cup Tour;

Whereas Davey Allison had over 19 career wins, including the
Daytona 500, 3 Winston 500’s, and the 1991 Coca-Cola
600;

Whereas Davey Allison had the 10th-highest career earnings of any NASCAR driver in history, with winnings of over \$6,726,974;

Whereas Davey Allison hailed from one of racing's most noble and famous families;

Whereas stock-car racing will not be the same without an Allison racing;

Whereas the Nation wishes to express its heartfelt sense of mourning to Davey Allison's wife Liz, children Krista Marie and Robert Grey, and parents Bobby and Judy; and

Whereas the world of racing will not shine as brightly without a person like Davey Allison: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That April 29, 1994, is designated as "Davey Allison Re-
4 membrance Day", and the President is authorized and re-
5 quested to issue a proclamation calling on the people of
6 the United States to observe the day with appropriate
7 ceremonies and activities.
