JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States allowing an item veto in appropriations bills and an item veto of contract authority or taxation changes in any other bill.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when

- 1 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 2 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 3 for ratification:
- 4 "Article—

"The President shall have the power to disapprove 5 in whole or in part any appropriation, any authority for the United States to enter into a contract, or any change in the rate or incidence of taxation on any special class 8 of taxpayers and approve any other provision in the same 10 bill. In such case he shall, in signing the bill, designate the appropriations, contract authority, or tax provisions 11 disapproved, and shall return a copy of such disapproved 12 appropriations, contract authority, or tax provisions, with his objections, to the House in which the bill shall have 14 15 originated; and the same proceedings shall then be had
