## A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to ensure that whistleblowers are protected from having to submit, without just cause, to psychological or psychiatric evaluations or counselling.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       That section 2302(a)(2) of title 5, United States Code,

4       is amended—

5               (1) by striking “and” at the end of clause (ix);

6               (2) by adding “and” after the semicolon in

7       clause (x); and

8               (3) by adding after clause (x) the following:

1           “(xi) referral for psychiatric or psycho-  
2           logical counselling or examination, and the  
3           maintenance of records or reports referencing  
4           such counselling or examination.”.
