## A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to require a three-fifths vote in the House of Representatives to waive any point of order under this Act.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That section 904(c) of the Congressional Budget Act of  
4       1974 is amended by adding at the end the following new  
5       sentence: "Any point of order set forth in title III, IV,  
6       or VI may be waived or suspended in the House of Rep-

- 1 representatives only by the affirmative vote of three-fifths of
- 2 the Members voting, a quorum being present.”.
