# A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1995, the existing suspension of duty on certain wicker products.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION OF
- 4 DUTY ON CERTAIN WICKER PRODUCTS.
- 5 Heading 9902.46.02 of the Harmonized Tariff
- 6 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking "12/
- 7 31/92" and inserting "12/31/94".

#### SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
- 3 1 takes effect on the 15th day after the date of the enact-
- 4 ment of this Act.
- 5 (b) Retroactive Provision.—Notwithstanding sec-
- 6 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
- 7 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
- 8 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
- 9 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
- 10 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-
- 11 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—
- 12 (1) after December 31, 1992; and
- 13 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
- 14 actment of this Act;
- 15 and with respect to which there would have been a lower
- 16 duty if the amendment made by section 1 had applied to
- 17 such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated or
- 18 reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had oc-
- 19 curred on such 15th day.
