Mr. COYNE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To revive the suspension of duty on 1,5-naphthalene diisocyanate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION OF**
4 **DUTY.**

5 Heading 9902.30.07 (relating to 1,5-naphthalene
6 diisocyanate) of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
7 United States is amended by striking out “12/31/92” and
8 inserting “12/31/95”.

9 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

10 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by sub-
11 section (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or with-

1 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the
2 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO TERMINATION OF
4 PREVIOUS SUSPENSION.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
5 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-
6 vision of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-
7 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
8 of the enactment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal
9 from warehouse for consumption, of any good described
10 in heading 9902.30.07 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule
11 of the United States that was made—

12 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

13 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
14 actment of this Act;

15 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
16 or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after the date of
17 the enactment of this Act.
