A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act to designate the Great Western Trail for potential addition to the National Trails System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF THE GREAT WESTERN TRAIL**

4 **AS A STUDY TRAIL.**

5 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
6 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7 lowing new paragraph:

8 “() The Great Western Scenic Trail, a system of
9 trails to accommodate a variety of travel users in a cor-

1 ridor of approximately 3,100 miles in length extending
2 from the Arizona-Mexico border to the Idaho-Montana-
3 Canada border, following the approximate route depicted
4 on the map identified as 'Great Western Trail Corridor,
5 1988', which shall be on file and available for public in-
6 spection in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service,
7 United States Department of Agriculture. The trail shall
8 be administered by the Secretary of Agriculture. Notwith-
9 standing section 7, motorized vehicles may be permitted,
10 in accordance with rules prescribed by the Secretary of
11 Agriculture, on components of the Great Western Scenic
12 Trail system.'.
