A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to ensure equitable treatment for members of the Armed Forces from outside the continental United States in the provision of excess leave and permissive temporary duty in connection with the separation of the members from the Armed Services.

- 5 (a) Equitable Treatment of Members from
- 6 Outside the Continental United States.—Section
- 7 1149 of title 10, United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) by inserting "(a) Provision as Part of
2	SEPARATION.—" before "Under regulations"; and
3	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
4	section:
5	"(b) Members from Outside the Continental
6	United States.—(1) In prescribing regulations under
7	subsection (a), the Secretary of Defense shall ensure that
8	a member whose home of record is outside the continental
9	United States and who is stationed inside the continental
10	United States at the time of the separation of the member
11	will be eligible to receive the same amount of excess leave
12	or permissive temporary duty under this section as a mem-
13	ber who is stationed overseas.
14	"(2) In this subsection, the term 'continental United
15	States' means the 48 contiguous States and the District
16	of Columbia.''.
17	(b) Report on Other Areas of Inequitable
18	TREATMENT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of
19	the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall
20	submit a report to Congress—
21	(1) describing all provisions of law concerning
22	pay and allowances for members of the Armed
23	Forces in which members whose homes of record are
24	outside the continental United States and who are
25	stationed inside the continental United States re-

- ceive different treatment than members who are stationed outside the United States; and
- 3 (2) containing recommendations to equalize 4 such treatment.
