AN ACT

Making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year
ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
5 vide supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending
6 September 30, 1993, and for other purposes, namely:

 2 shall also be made available to producers for 1993, 1994,
 3 and 1995 crop losses if such losses are due to the occurrence
 4 of Hurricanes Andrew and Iniki and Typhoon Omar: Pro-
 5 vided further, That such funds shall be made available
 6 under the same terms and conditions as authorized for
 7 1990, 1991, and 1992 crop losses: Provided further, That
 8 no payments to producers under this Act shall be at a rate
 9 greater than the rate used in making payments under Pub-
 10 lic Law 102–229 and Public Law 102–368: Provided fur-
 11 ther, That any such funds shall remain available until Sep-
 12 tember 30, 1993: Provided further, That no funds may be
 13 used pursuant to the last clause of the fifth proviso of the
 14 appropriation for the Commodity Credit Corporation in
 15 Public Law 102–368.
