A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to revise and extend the program of grants relating to preventive health measures with respect to breast and cervical cancer.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Breast and Cervical
5	Cancer Amendments of 1993".
6	SEC. 2. REVISIONS IN PROGRAM OF STATE GRANTS RE-
7	GARDING BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER.
8	(a) Limited Authority Regarding For-Profit
9	Entities.—
10	(1) In general.—Section 1501(b) of the Public
11	Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300k(b)) is amended—
12	(A) by striking "States.—A State" and all
13	that follows through ''may expend'' and inserting
14	the following: "STATES.—
15	"(1) In general.—A State receiving a grant
16	under subsection (a) may, subject to paragraphs (2)
17	and (3), expend"; and
18	(B) by adding at the end the following
19	paragraphs:
20	"(2) Limited authority regarding other
21	ENTITIES.—In addition to the authority established
22	in paragraph (1) for a State with respect to grants
23	and contracts, the State may provide for screenings
24	under subsection (a)(1) through entering into con-
25	tracts with private entities.

1 "(3) Payments for screenings.—The amount 2 paid by a State to an entity under this subsection for a screening procedure under subsection (a)(1) may 3 4 not exceed the amount that would be paid under part B of title XVIII of the Social Security Act if payment 5 were made under such part for furnishing the proce-6 dure to a woman enrolled under such part.". 7 8 (2) Conforming amendment.—Section 1505(3) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300n-9 10 1(3)) is amended by inserting before the semicolon the following: "(and additionally, in the case of services 11 and activities under section 1501(a)(1), with any 12 13 similar services or activities of private entities)". (b) Quality Assurance Regarding Screening 14 15 Procedures.— (1) In General.—Section 1503 of the Public 16 17 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300m) is amended by 18 striking subsections (c) through (e) and inserting the 19 following: "(c) Quality Assurance Regarding Screening 20 Procedures.—The Secretary may not make a grant 21 under section 1501 unless the State involved agrees that the State will, in accordance with applicable law, assure the 23

quality of screening procedures conducted pursuant to such

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section.".

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1 (2)Transition rule REGARDING MAMMO-2 GRAPHIES.—With respect to the screening procedure 3 for breast cancer known as a mammography, the requirements in effect on the day before the date of the enactment of this Act under section 1503(c) of the 5 6 Public Health Service Act remain in effect (for an in-7 dividual or facility conducting such procedures pur-8 suant to a grant to a State under section 1501 of such Act) until there is in effect for the facility a certifi-9 10 cate (or provisional certificate) issued under section 11 354 of such Act. 12 (c) Statewide Provision of Services.—Section 1504(c) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 13 300n(c)) is amended by adding at the end the following 14 15 paragraph: 16 "(3) Grants to tribes and tribal organiza-17 TIONS.— 18 "(A) The Secretary, acting through the Di-19 rector of the Centers for Disease Control and 20 Prevention, may make grants to tribes and tribal organizations (as such terms are used in para-21 22 graph (1)) for the purpose of carrying out pro-23 grams described in section 1501(a). This title ap-24 plies to such a grant (in relation to the jurisdiction of the tribe or organization) to the same ex-25

1	tent and in the same manner as such title ap-
2	plies to a grant to a State under section 1501
3	(in relation to the jurisdiction of the State).
4	"(B) If a tribe or tribal organization is re-
5	ceiving a grant under subparagraph (A) and the
6	State in which the tribe or organization is lo-
7	cated is receiving a grant under section 1501, the
8	requirement established in paragraph (1) for the
9	State regarding the tribe or organization is
10	deemed to have been waived under paragraph
11	(2). ''.
12	(d) Evaluations and Reports.—Section 1508 of the
13	Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300n-4) is amend-
14	ed—
15	(1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the
16	following sentence: "Such evaluations shall include
17	evaluations of the extent to which States carrying out
18	such programs are in compliance with section
19	1501(a)(2) and with section 1504(c)."; and
20	(2) in subsection (b), by inserting before the pe-
21	riod the following: ", including recommendations re-
22	garding compliance by the States with section
23	1501(a)(2) and with section 1504(c)".
24	(e) Establishment of Coordinating Commit-
25	TEE — Section 1501 of the Public Health Service Act (42)

U.S.C. 300k) is amended by adding at the end the following subsection: 3 "(c) Coordinating Committee Regarding Year 2000 Health Objectives.—The Secretary, through the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, shall establish a committee to coordinate the activities of the agencies of the Public Health Service (and other appropriate Federal agencies) that are carried out to-8 ward achieving the objectives established by the Secretary for reductions in the incidence of breast and cervical cancer in the United States by the year 2000. Such committee shall be comprised of Federal officers or employees designated by the heads of the agencies involved to serve on the committee as representatives of the agencies, and such representatives from other public or private entities as the Secretary determines to be appropriate.". 17 (f) Technical Corrections.—Title XV of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300k et seq.) is amended— 18 19 (1) in section 1501(a), in the matter preceding paragraph (1), by striking "Control," and inserting 20 "Control and Prevention.": and 21 22 (2) in section 1505 paragraph 23 (A)in (3),by striking "nonprivate" and inserting "nonprofit private"; 24 25 and

3	SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM
4	OF GRANTS FOR ADDITIONAL PREVENTIVE
5	HEALTH SERVICES FOR WOMEN.
6	(a) In General.—Title XV of the Public Health Serv-
7	ice Act (42 U.S.C. 300k et seq.) is amended—
8	(1) by redesignating section 1509 as section
9	1510; and
10	(2) by inserting after section 1508 the following
11	section:
12	"SEC. 1509. SUPPLEMENTAL GRANTS FOR ADDITIONAL PRE-
13	VENTIVE HEALTH SERVICES.
14	"(a) Demonstration Projects.—In the case of
15	States receiving grants under section 1501, the Secretary,
16	acting through the Director of the Centers for Disease Con-
17	trol and Prevention, may make grants to not more than
18	3 such States to carry out demonstration projects for the
19	purpose of—
20	"(1) providing preventive health services in ad-
21	dition to the services authorized in such section, in-
22	cluding screenings regarding blood pressure and cho-
23	lesterol, and including health education;
24	"(2) providing appropriate referrals for medical
25	treatment of women receiving services pursuant to

paragraph (1) and ensuring, to the extent practicable, 1 2 the provision of appropriate follow-up services; and 3 "(3) evaluating activities conducted under para-4 graphs (1) and (2) through appropriate surveillance 5 or program-monitoring activities. 6 "(b) Status as Participant in Program Regard-ING Breast and Cervical Cancer.—The Secretary may not make a grant under subsection (a) unless the State in-8 volved agrees that services under the grant will be provided only through entities that are screening women for breast 10 or cervical cancer pursuant to a grant under section 1501. "(c) Applicability of Provisions of General Pro-12 GRAM.—This title applies to a grant under subsection (a) 13 to the same extent and in the same manner as such title 14 15 applies to a grant under section 1501. "(d) Funding.— 16 17 "(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2), for 18 the purpose of carrying out this section, there are au-19 thorized to be appropriated \$3,000,000 for fiscal year 20 1994, and such sums as may be necessary for each of 21 the fiscal years 1995 through 1998. 22 "(2) Limitation regarding funding with re-SPECT TO BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER.—The au-23 24 thorization of appropriations established in para-25 graph (1) is not effective for a fiscal year unless the

- 1 amount appropriated under section 1510(a) for the
- 2 fiscal year equals or exceeds the amount appropriated
- 3 under such section for the preceding fiscal year.".
- 4 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 1510(a) of
- 5 the Public Health Service Act, as redesignated by subsection
- 6 (a)(1) of this section, is amended in the heading for the
- 7 section by striking "**FUNDING.**" and inserting "**FUNDING**
- 8 FOR GENERAL PROGRAM.".
- 9 SEC. 4. FUNDING FOR GENERAL PROGRAM.
- 10 Section 1510(a) of the Public Health Service Act, as
- 11 redesignated by section 3(a)(1) of this Act, is amended—
- 12 (1) by striking "and" after "1991,"; and
- 13 (2) by inserting before the period the following:
- 14 *", \$135,000,000 for fiscal year 1994, and such sums*
- as may be necessary for each of the fiscal years 1995
- 16 through 1998".
