A BILL

To amend section 1977A of the Revised Statutes to equalize the remedies available to all victims of intentional employment discrimination, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Equal Remedies Act
5 of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. EQUALIZATION OF REMEDIES.**

7 Section 1977A of the Revised Statutes, as added by
8 section 102 of the Civil Rights Act of 1991, is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (b)—

2 (A) by striking paragraph (3), and

3 (B) by redesignating paragraph (4) as
4 paragraph (3), and

5 (2) in subsection (c) by striking “section—”

6 and all that follows through the period, and insert-

7 ing “section, any party may demand a jury trial.”.
