AN ACT

Making supplemental appropriations, transfers, and rescissions for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
- 4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
- 5 vide supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending
- 6 September 30, 1993, and for other purposes, namely:

14	experience and classroom programs (if such
15	programs are combined with other education
16	and training activities), which may be used by
17	such youth and young adults for transportation,
18	food, grooming, and other basic necessities;";
19	(2) by redesignating paragraphs (4) through
20	(9) as paragraphs (5) through (10); and
21	(3) by inserting after paragraph (3) the follow-
22	ing new paragraph:
23	"(4) contain assurances that—
24	"(A) in providing services under paragraph
25	(3), the participating community will maintain

1	a ratio of approximately 1 case worker for every
2	25 participants;
3	"(B) employment provided under such
4	paragraph to any youth or young adult will not
5	exceed 20 hours per week; and
6	"(C) the amount of a stipend provided
7	under such paragraph to any youth or young
8	adult will not be less than \$100 per week and
9	will reflect the cost of living in the participating
10	community;''.
11	(b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
12	(1) In general.—Section 3 of the Act is
13	amended by adding at the end the following new
14	subsection:
15	"(g) There are authorized to be appropriated to carry
16	out part H of title IV \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 1993
17	and such sums as may be necessary for each of the fiscal
18	years 1994 through 1997.".
19	(2) Repeal.—Section 3(c)(3) of the Act is re-
20	pealed effective July 1, 1993.
21	(c) Effective Date for Part H of Title IV of
22	THE ACT.—Section 701 of the Job Training Reform
23	Amendments of 1992 is amended by adding at the end
24	the following new subsection:

- 1 "(k) YOUTH FAIR CHANCE PROGRAM.—The amend-
- 2 ment made by section 406 shall take effect on the date
- 3 of the enactment of the Second Supplemental Appropria-
- 4 tions Act of 1993.".
- 5 (d) Effective Date.—Except as provided in sub-
- 6 section (b)(2), the amendments made by this section shall
- 7 take effect on the date of the enactment of this Act.
- 8 This Act may be cited as the "Second Supplemental
- 9 Appropriations Act of 1993".
