A BILL

Making supplemental appropriations, transfers, and rescissions for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
5 vide supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending
6 September 30, 1993, and for other purposes, namely:

1 **TITLE I—SUPPLEMENTAL**
2 **APPROPRIATIONS**

3 DEPARTMENT OF LABOR

4 EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATION

5 TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

6 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

7 For an additional amount for “Training and employ-
8 ment services”, \$320,000,000, to be available upon enact-
9 ment of this Act, to carry into effect the Job Training
10 Partnership Act, of which \$5,500,000 is for activities
11 under part D of title IV of such Act, of which up to
12 \$1,500,000 may be transferred to the Program Adminis-
13 tration account, and of which \$314,500,000 is for activi-
14 ties under part B of title II of such Act.

15 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

16 STATE REVOLVING FUNDS/CONSTRUCTION GRANTS

17 For an additional amount for “State revolving funds/
18 construction grants”, to make grants under title VI of the
19 Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended,
20 \$200,000,000, to remain available until September 30,
21 1994: *Provided*, That notwithstanding section 602(b)(2)
22 of such Act, no State match shall be required for this addi-
23 tional amount: *Provided further*, That notwithstanding
24 section 602(b)(3) of such Act, States shall enter into bind-
25 ing commitments to provide assistance in an amount equal
26 to 100 percent of the amount of each grant payment with-

1 in one year after receipt of such grant payment from this
2 additional amount.

3 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
4 FARMERS HOME ADMINISTRATION
5 RURAL DEVELOPMENT INSURANCE FUND PROGRAM
6 ACCOUNT

7 For an additional amount for the “Rural development
8 insurance fund program account”, for the costs of water
9 and sewer direct loans, \$35,543,000, to subsidize addi-
10 tional gross obligations for the principal amount of direct
11 loans not to exceed \$250,000,000.

12 RURAL WATER AND WASTE DISPOSAL GRANTS

13 For an additional amount for “Rural water and waste
14 disposal grants”, \$35,000,000, to remain available until
15 expended.

16 DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
17 OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS
18 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE

19 For an additional amount for “Justice assistance”,
20 \$200,000,000 for grants authorized by subpart 1 of part
21 E of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets
22 Act of 1968, as amended: *Provided*, That such funds shall
23 be available only for the first year cost of the salaries and
24 benefits, excluding overtime payments, resulting from the
25 hiring of additional sworn law enforcement personnel.

3 GRANTS TO THE NATIONAL RAILROAD PASSENGER

5 For an additional amount for “Grants to the Na-

7 able until expended, \$51,000,000, of which \$30,000,000
8 shall be available for operating losses incurred by the Cor-
9 poration, and of which \$21,000,000 shall be available for
10 capital improvements.

13 (BY TRANSFER)

14 For an additional amount for “Salaries and ex-
15 penses”, \$14,000,000, to carry out section 24 of the Small
16 Business Act, as amended, to be derived by transfer from
17 amounts provided in Public Law 102-395 for the credit
18 subsidy cost of the SBIC Program.

13 SEC. 301. No part of any appropriation contained in
14 this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
15 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

16 COMMUNITY INVESTMENT PROGRAM

17 SEC. 302. None of the funds made available for the
18 Community Investment Program by Public Law 102-368
19 shall be available prior to September 30, 1993.

20 SEC. 303. None of the funds in this Act, or any other
21 Act, may be used to pay for the relocation of the Human
22 Nutrition Information Service.

23 This Act may be cited as the “Second Supplemental
24 Appropriations Act of 1993”.
