Mr. KYL (for himself and Ms. EDDIE BERNICE JOHNSON of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To require each recipient of a grant or contract under section 1001 of the Public Health Service Act to provide information concerning breast and cervical cancer.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION. 1. BREAST AND CERVICAL INFORMATION.**

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
5 “Breast and Cervical Cancer Information Act of 1993”.

6 (b) AMENDMENT.—Title X of the Public Health
7 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300 et seq.) is amended by adding
8 at the end the following new section:

1 **“SEC. 1010. BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER INFORMATION.**

2 “Each recipient of a grant or contract under section
3 1001 shall provide, to such individuals as the recipient de-
4 termines appropriate, information (in a culturally com-
5 petent manner) concerning breast and cervical cancer, in-
6 cluding information on the need for breast self-examina-
7 tions and the skills for such self-examinations, and shall
8 refer such clients as the recipient determines appropriate
9 for breast and cervical cancer screening, treatment or
10 other services.”.

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
