A BILL

To amend the Solid Waste Disposal Act to require each department, agency, and instrumentality of the executive branch of the Federal Government to use recycled paper.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT FOR FEDERAL GOVERNMENT**

4 **TO USE RECYCLED PAPER.**

5 (a) REQUIREMENT.—Subtitle F of the Solid Waste
6 Disposal Act (42 U.S.C. 6961 et seq.) is amended by add-
7 ing at the end the following new section:

1 **“SEC. 6005. REQUIREMENT FOR FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO**
2 **USE RECYCLED PAPER.**

3 “(a) REQUIREMENT.—Each department, agency, and
4 instrumentality of the executive branch of the Federal
5 Government shall use printing and writing paper contain-
6 ing at least 10 percent postconsumer material.

7 “(b) POSTCONSUMER MATERIAL DEFINITION.—For
8 purposes of this section, the term ‘postconsumer material’
9 has the meaning provided by the Administrator in regula-
10 tions implementing this section.

11 “(c) REPORT.—(1) Not later than January 1 of each
12 year, the Administrator shall submit to Congress a report
13 on the extent of compliance during the preceding fiscal
14 year by each department, agency, and instrumentality of
15 the executive branch of the Federal Government with the
16 requirement of subsection (a). At a minimum, the report
17 shall include—

18 “(A) an identification of each department,
19 agency, and instrumentality that failed to comply, in
20 whole or in part, with the requirement; and

21 “(B) with respect to each department, agency,
22 and instrumentality that failed to comply with the
23 requirement, a statement of the reasons for the fail-
24 ure to comply.

25 “(2) A copy of the annual report shall be published
26 in the Federal Register.

1 “(d) PROCEEDS FROM SALE OF MATERIALS COL-
2 LECTED FROM RECYCLING.—If a department, agency, or
3 instrumentality of the executive branch of the Federal
4 Government is in compliance with the requirement of sub-
5 section (a) during a fiscal year, as determined by the Ad-
6 ministrator, such entity may use, for activities within the
7 legal authority of such entity, any monies received during
8 such fiscal year from the sale of materials collected for
9 the purpose of recycling. This subsection applies to the
10 Department of Defense notwithstanding section 2577 of
11 title 10, United States Code.”.

12 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Section 6005 of the Solid
13 Waste Disposal Act, as added by subsection (a), shall take
14 effect one year after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
