opportunity to engage in a commercial venture pursuant to a contract, joint venture, or other commercial transaction, including an opportunity to bid or
tender an offer for a contract,

9 may bring an action in an appropriate district court of 10 the United States against the United States person com-11 mitting the violation, for recovery of actual damages in-12 curred on account of such act of discrimination or lost 13 opportunity. In any such action the court may award puni-14 tive damages.".
