- 3 (a) Limitation.—The Secretary of Defense may not
- 4 conduct a launch of a missile as part of a test program
- 5 in any case in which an unavoidable or anticipated result
- 6 of the launch would be the release of debris in a land area
- 7 of the United States outside a designated Department of
- 8 Defense test range.
- 9 (b) Definition of Debris.—For purposes of sub-
- 10 section (a), the term "debris" does not include particulate
- 11 matter that is regulated for considerations of air quality.
