AN ACT

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for relief from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
- 4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
- 5 vide emergency supplemental appropriations for relief
- 6 from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for
- 7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other
- 8 purposes, namely:

6	For an additional amount for emergency expenses re-

8	of 1993, \$3,500,000, to remain available through June 30,
9	1994: Provided, That the entire amount is designated by
10	Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
11	251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
12	Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further, That notwith-
13	standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-
14	vided herein for Economic Development Assistance pro-

16	tration' shall be \$200,000,000, of which \$100,000,000 shall
17	only be available to the extent an official budget request
18	for a specific dollar amount, that includes designation of
19	the entire amount of the request as an emergency require-

21	Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by
22	the President to Congress: Provided further, That notwith-
23	standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-
24	vided herein for the Disaster Loan Program account under
25	the heading "Small Business Administration" shall be

- 1 \$80,000,000, of which \$20,000,000 shall be available only
- 2 to the extent an official budget request for a specific dollar
- 3 amount, that includes designation of the entire amount of
- 4 the request as an emergency requirement as defined in the
- 5 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
- 6 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the President to Con-
- 7 gress: Provided further, That notwithstanding any other
- 8 provision of law, the \$500,000 limitation on the amounts
- 9 outstanding and committed to a borrower provided in para-
- 10 graph 7(c)(6) of the Small Business Act shall be increased
- 11 to \$1,500,000 for Presidentially-declared major disasters for
- 12 recent Midwest flooding: Provided further, That notwith-
- 13 standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-
- 14 vided herein under the heading "Employment and Training
- 15 Administration" for part B of title III of the Job Training
- 16 Partnership Act shall be \$54,600,000, of which \$11,100,000
- 17 shall be available only to the extent an official budget re-
- 18 quest for a specific dollar amount, that includes designation
- 19 of the entire amount of the request as an emergency require-
- 20 ment as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency
- 21 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by
- 22 the President to Congress: Provided further, That notwith-
- 23 standing any other provision of this Act, the amount pro-
- 24 vided herein for programs and activities of the Commission
- 25 on National and Community Service shall be \$4,000,000,

- 1 of which \$2,000,000 shall be available only to the extent
- 2 an official budget request for a specific dollar amount, that
- 3 includes designation of the entire amount of the request as
- 4 an emergency requirement as defined in the Balanced
- 5 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as
- 6 amended, is transmitted by the President to Congress: Pro-
- 7 vided further, That all of the above amounts are designated
- 8 by Congress as emergency requirements pursuant to section
- 9 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
- 10 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.
- Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the
- 12 following shall be the law with respect to the Commodity
- 13 Credit Corporation.
- 14 COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION
- 15 COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION FUND
- 16 For an additional amount for the "Commodity Credit
- 17 Corporation Fund" to cover 1993 crop losses resulting from
- 18 damaging weather or related floods associated with the con-
- 19 ditions (as defined in section 2251 of Public Law 101–624),
- 20 in 1993, \$1,050,000,000, and in addition \$300,000,000,
- 21 which shall be available only to the extent an official budget
- 22 request for a specific dollar amount, that includes designa-
- 23 tion of the entire amount of the request as an emergency
- 24 requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emer-
- 25 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmit-

- 1 ted by the President to Congress, the total to remain avail-
- 2 able until June 30, 1994: Provided, That from funds pre-
- 3 viously made available in Public Law 102-368 by Presi-
- 4 dential declaration, \$100,000,000 to remain available until
- 5 June 30, 1994, shall be for 1993 crop losses only: Provided
- 6 further, That if prior to April 1, 1994, the President deter-
- 7 mines that extraordinary circumstances exist that warrant
- 8 further assistance, the Secretary of Agriculture shall use
- 9 such funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation as are nec-
- 10 essary to make payments in an amount equal to 100 per-
- 11 cent of each eligible claim as determined under title XXII
- 12 of Public Law 101-624: Provided further, That all addi-
- 13 tional amounts made available herein are subject to the
- 14 terms and conditions in Public Law 101-624: Provided fur-
- 15 ther, That Congress hereby designates the entire amount
- 16 provided herein as an emergency requirement pursuant to
- 17 section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-
- 18 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: Provided
- 19 further, That notwithstanding any provision of Public Law
- 20 103–50, funds provided by such Act shall not be expended
- 21 for 1993 crop losses resulting from 1993 natural disasters,
- 22 and claims for assistance from funds provided by that Act
- 23 by producers with 1990, 1991, and 1992 crop losses shall
- 24 be paid only to the extent such claims are filed by Septem-
- 25 ber 17, 1993.

1 (a) The Senate finds that:

- (1) Numerous atrocities have been reported on the conflict in the former Yugoslavia;
- (2) Such atrocities against innocent civilians and prisoners would violate universally accepted law as embodied in the Geneva Conventions of August 12, 1949 for the Protection of War Victims; the Hague Convention (IV) Respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land and the Regulations annexed thereto of October 18, 1907; the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide of December 9, 1948; and the Charter of the International Military Tribunal of August 8, 1945;
 - (3) In October 1992 the United Nations Security Council adopted Resolution 780 establishing a Commission of Experts to gather and evaluate evidence of such war crimes;
 - (4) The Commission of Experts submitted an interim report dated January 26, 1993 which concluded that grave breaches and other violations of international humanitarian law had been committed in the territory of the former Yugoslavia, including wilful killing, "ethnic cleansing," mass killings, torture, rape, pillage, and destruction of civilian property, de-

1	struction of cultural and religious property and arbi-
2	trary arrests;
3	(5) The Commission of Experts has been hin-
4	dered in carrying out fully its legal charge because of
5	insufficient resources;
6	(6) On February 22, 1993, the United Nations
7	Security Council adopted Resolution 808 establishing
8	an international tribunal to try individuals accused
9	of the commission of war crimes in the former Yugo-
10	slavia;
11	(7) On May 3, 1993, the Secretary General of the
12	United Nations issued his report which established the
13	procedures for an international war crimes tribunal,
14	(8) The United Nations is presently in the proc-
15	ess of selecting judges and prosecutors for the inter-
16	national war crimes tribunal;
17	(9) According to reports, the atrocities in the
18	former Yugoslavia continue unabated; and
19	(10) There is a dire need to establish promptly
20	the tribunal and commence prosecution of alleged war
21	criminals: Now, therefore.
22	(b) The Senate hereby commends the United Nations
23	for its recognition of the importance and necessity of the

24 rule of law as evidenced by its establishment of an inter-

1	national tribunal for the prosecution of war crimes in the
2	former Yugoslavia.
3	(c) It is the sense of the Senate that the United Nations
4	should—
5	(1) expedite the selection of judges and prosecu-
6	tors for the tribunal in order to begin prosecutions of
7	alleged war criminals; and
8	(2) provide all assistance necessary to continue
9	gathering evidence for such prosecutions.

- 6 extraordinary circumstances exist that warrant further as-
- 7 sistance, the Secretary of Agriculture shall use such funds
- 8 of the Commodity Credit Corporation as are necessary to
- 9 make payments in an amount equal to 50.04 percent of
