AN ACT

- To amend the John F. Kennedy Center Act to transfer operating responsibilities to the Board of Trustees of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "John F. Kennedy Cen-
- 5 ter Act Amendments of 1994".

1	SEC. 2. FINDINGS, BUREAU, BOARD OF TRUSTEES, AND AD-
2	VISORY COMMITTEE.
3	(a) FINDINGS.—Section 1 of the John F. Kennedy
4	Center Act (20 U.S.C. 76h note) is amended—
5	(1) by striking "SECTION 1." and inserting the
6	following:
7	"SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE AND FINDINGS.
8	"(a) SHORT TITLE.—"; and
9	(2) by adding at the end the following:
10	"(b) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
11	"(1) the late John Fitzgerald Kennedy served
12	with distinction as President of the United States
13	and as a Member of the Senate and the House of
14	Representatives;
15	"(2) by the untimely death of John Fitzgerald
16	Kennedy this Nation and the world have suffered a
17	great loss;
18	"(3) the late John Fitzgerald Kennedy was par-
19	ticularly devoted to education and cultural under-
20	standing and the advancement of the performing
21	arts;
22	"(4) it is fitting and proper that a living insti-
23	tution of the performing arts, designated as the Na-
24	tional Center for the Performing Arts, named in the
25	memory and honor of this great leader, shall serve

1	as the sole national monument to his memory within
2	the District of Columbia and its environs;
3	"(5) such a living memorial serves all of the
4	people of the United States by preserving, fostering,
5	and transmitting the performing arts traditions of
6	the people of this Nation and other countries by pro-
7	ducing and presenting music, opera, theater, dance,
8	and other performing arts; and
9	''(6) such a living memorial should be housed in
10	the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing
11	Arts, located in the District of Columbia.".
12	(b) Ex Officio Trustees.—
13	(1) IN GENERAL.—Section 2 of such Act (20
14	U.S.C. 76h) is amended—
15	(A) by striking the section heading and all
16	that follows before ''There is hereby'' and in-
17	serting the following:
18	"SEC. 2. BOARD OF TRUSTEES.
19	"(a) Establishment.—";
20	(B) in the first sentence by inserting "as
21	the National Center for the Performing Arts, a
22	living memorial to John Fitzgerald Kennedy,"
23	after "thereof";
24	(C) in the second sentence by striking
25	"Chairman of the District of Columbia Recre-

ation Board" and inserting "Superintendent of Schools of the District of Columbia"; and

3 (D) in the second sentence by striking "three Members of the Senate" and all that fol-4 lows before "ex officio" and inserting "the 5 chairman and ranking minority member of the 6 Committee on Public Works and Transpor-7 tation of the House of Representatives and 3 8 additional Members of the House of Represent-9 atives appointed by the Speaker of the House of 10 11 Representatives, and the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Environ-12 13 ment and Public Works of the Senate and 3 additional Members of the Senate appointed by 14 the President of the Senate". 15

16 (2) Effective dates.—

17 (A) SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS OF 18 THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.—The amendment 19 made by paragraph (1)(C) shall take effect on 20 the date of expiration of the term of the Chair-21 man of the District of Columbia Recreation 22 Board serving as a trustee of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts on the 23 date of the enactment of this Act. 24

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1 (B) MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.—The 2 amendment made by paragraph (1)(D) shall 3 take effect on the date of the enactment of this 4 Act.

5 (c) GENERAL TRUSTEES.—Section 2(b) of such Act6 is amended to read as follows:

7 "(b) GENERAL TRUSTEES.—The general trustees
8 shall be appointed by the President of the United States
9 and each such trustee shall hold office as a member of
10 the Board for a term of 6 years, except that—

"(1) any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the expiration of the term for which
such member's predecessor was appointed shall be
appointed for the remainder of such term;

15 "(2) a member shall continue to serve until16 such member's successor has been appointed; and

"(3) the term of office of a member appointed
before the date of the enactment of the John F.
Kennedy Center Act Amendments of 1994 shall expire as designated at the time of appointment.".

21 (d) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE ARTS.—Section
22 2(c) of such Act is amended—

23 (1) by inserting "ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON
24 THE ARTS.—" before "There shall be";

(2) in the first sentence by inserting "of the
 United States" after "President" the first place it
 appears;

4 (3) in the fifth sentence by striking "cultural
5 activities to be carried on in" and inserting "cultural
6 activities to be carried out by"; and

7 (4) in the last sentence by striking all that fol-8 lows "compensation" and inserting a period.

9 SEC. 3. DUTIES OF THE BOARD.

10 Section 4 of the John F. Kennedy Center Act (20 11 U.S.C. 76j) is amended by striking the section heading 12 and all that follows through the period at the end of sub-13 section (a) and inserting the following:

14 "SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE BOARD.

15 "(a) Programs, Activities, and Goals.—

16 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Board shall—

17 "(A) present classical and contemporary
18 music, opera, drama, dance, and other perform19 ing arts from the United States and other coun20 tries;

21 "(B) promote and maintain the John F.
22 Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts as the
23 National Center for the Performing Arts—

24 "(i) by developing and maintaining a25 leadership role in national performing arts

1	education policy and programs, including
2	developing and presenting original and in-
3	novative performing arts and educational
4	programs for children, youth, families,
5	adults, and educators designed specifically
6	to foster an appreciation and understand-
7	ing of the performing arts;
8	''(ii) by developing and maintaining a
9	comprehensive and broad program for na-
10	tional and community outreach, including
11	establishing model programs for adaptation
12	by other presenting and educational insti-
13	tutions; and
14	''(iii) by conducting joint initiatives
15	with the national education and outreach
16	programs of the Very Special Arts, an en-
17	tity affiliated with the John F. Kennedy
18	Center for the Performing Arts which has
19	an established program for the identifica-
20	tion, development, and implementation of
21	model programs and projects in the arts
22	for disabled individuals;
23	"(C) strive to ensure that the education
24	and outreach programs and policies of the John
25	F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts

1	meet the highest level of excellence and reflect
2	the cultural diversity of the Nation;
3	"(D) provide facilities for other civic activi-
4	ties at the John F. Kennedy Center for the
5	Performing Arts;
6	''(E) provide within the John F. Kennedy
7	Center for the Performing Arts a suitable me-
8	morial in honor of the late President;
9	''(F) develop, and update annually, a com-
10	prehensive building needs plan for the existing
11	features of the John F. Kennedy Center for the
12	Performing Arts;
13	''(G) plan, design, and construct all capital
14	projects at the John F. Kennedy Center for the
15	Performing Arts; and
16	''(H) provide information and interpreta-
17	tion; all maintenance, repair, and alteration of
18	the building of the John F. Kennedy Center for
19	the Performing Arts; and janitorial, security,
20	and all other services necessary for operating
21	the building and site of the John F. Kennedy
22	Center for the Performing Arts.
23	"(2) Administrative powers and duties.—
24	"(A) AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO CON-
25	TRACTS.—The Board, in accordance with appli-

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1 cable law, may enter into contracts or other ar-2 rangements with, and make payments to, public 3 agencies or private organizations or persons in 4 order to carry out the Board's functions under 5 this Act. Such authority includes utilizing the 6 services and facilities of other agencies, includ-7 ing the Department of the Interior, the General 8 Services Administration, and the Smithsonian Institution. 9

"(B) PREPARATION OF BUDGET.—The
Board shall prepare a budget pursuant to sections 1104, 1105(a), and 1513(b) of title 31,
United States Code.

14 "(C) USE OF AGENCY PERSONNEL.—The 15 Board may utilize or employ the services of the 16 personnel of any agency or instrumentality of 17 the Federal Government or the District of Co-18 lumbia, with the consent of the agency or the 19 instrumentality concerned, upon a reimbursable basis, and utilize voluntary and uncompensated 20 21 personnel.

"(D) SELECTION OF CONTRACTORS.—In
carrying out its duties under this Act, the
Board may negotiate any contract for an environmental system for, a protection system for,

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or a repair to, maintenance of, or restoration of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts with selected contractors and award the contract on the basis of contractor qualifications as well as price.

6 "(E) MAINTENANCE HALLS.—The OF Board shall maintain the Hall of Nations, the Hall of States, and the Grand Foyer of the 8 John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing 9 Arts in a manner that is suitable to a national 10 performing arts center that is operated as a 12 Presidential memorial and in a manner consist-13 ent with other national Presidential memorials.

14 "(F) MAINTENANCE OF GROUNDS.—The 15 Board shall manage and operate the grounds of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Perform-16 17 ing Arts in a manner consistent with National 18 Park Service regulations and agreements in ef-19 fect on the date of enactment of the John F. 20 Kennedy Center Act Amendments of 1994. No 21 change in the management and operation of 22 such grounds may be made without the express approval of the Secretary of the Interior and of 23 the Congress.". 24

3 (a) SOLICITATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS.—
4 Section 5 of the John F. Kennedy Center Act (20 U.S.C.
5 76k) is amended—

6 (1) by striking the section heading and all that 7 follows before "The Board is" and inserting the fol-8 lowing:

9 "SEC. 5. POWERS OF THE BOARD.

10 "(a) SOLICITATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS.— 11 "; and

(2) in subsection (a) by striking "Smithsonian
Institution" and inserting "John F. Kennedy Center
for the Performing Arts, as a bureau of the Smithsonian Institution,".

(b) APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES.—
Section 5(b) of such Act is amended to read as follows:
"(b) APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES.—

"(1) 20 CHAIRPERSON AND SECRETARY.—The 21 Board shall appoint and fix the compensation and 22 duties of a Chairperson of the John F. Kennedy 23 Center for the Performing Arts, who shall serve as 24 the chief executive officer of the Center, and a Sec-25 retary of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The Chairperson and Secretary shall 26 •HR 3567 RFS

1	be well qualified by experience and training to per-
2	form the duties of their offices.
3	"(2) Senior level executive and other
4	EMPLOYEES.—The Chairperson of the John F. Ken-
5	nedy Center for the Performing Arts may appoint—
6	''(A) a senior level executive who, by virtue
7	of the individual's background, shall be well
8	suited to be responsible for facilities manage-
9	ment and services and who may, without regard
10	to the provisions of title 5, United States Code,
11	be appointed and compensated with appro-
12	priated funds, except that such compensation
13	may not exceed the maximum rate of pay for
14	level IV of the Executive Schedule; and
15	"(B) such other officers and employees of
16	the John F. Kennedy Center for the Perform-
17	ing Arts as may be necessary for the efficient
18	administration of the functions of the Board.".
19	(c) Transfers; Review of Board Actions.—Sec-
20	tion 5 of such Act is amended by striking subsection (c)
21	and inserting the following:

"(c) TRANSFER OF PROPERTY.—Not later than October 1, 1995, such property, liabilities, contracts, records,
and unexpended balances of appropriations, authorizations, allocations, and other funds employed, held, used,

arising from, available to, or to be made available in con-1 nection with the functions transferred from the Secretary 2 3 of the Interior pursuant to the amendments made by the 4 John F. Kennedy Center Act Amendments of 1994 shall 5 be transferred, subject to section 1531 of title 31, United States Code, to the Board as the Board and the Secretary 6 7 of the Interior may determine appropriate. Unexpended funds transferred pursuant to this subsection shall be used 8 9 only for the purposes for which, and subject to the terms under which, the funds were originally authorized and ap-10 propriated. 11

12 "(d) TRANSFER OF PERSONNEL.—

13 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Employees of the National
14 Park Service assigned to duties related to those
15 functions being undertaken by the Board shall be
16 transferred with their functions to the Board not
17 later than October 1, 1995.

18 "(2) RIGHTS AND BENEFITS.—Transferred em-19 ployees shall remain in the Federal competitive serv-20 ice retaining all rights and benefits provided under title 5, United States Code. For a period of not less 21 22 than 3 years, transferred employees shall retain the right of priority consideration under merit promotion 23 24 procedures or lateral reassignment for all vacancies within the Department of the Interior. 25

"(3) PARK POLICE.—All United States Park
 Police and Park Police guard force employees as signed to the John F. Kennedy Center for the Per forming Arts shall remain employees of the National
 Park Service.

6 "(4) COSTS.—All usual and customary costs as-7 sociated with any adverse action or grievance pro-8 ceeding resulting from the transfer of functions 9 under this section that are incurred before October 10 1, 1995, shall be paid from amounts appropriated to 11 the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing 12 Arts.

13 "(5) REORGANIZATION AUTHORITY.—Nothing
14 contained in this section shall be deemed to prohibit
15 the Board from reorganizing functions at the John
16 F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in ac17 cordance with laws governing such reorganizations.

18 "(e) REVIEW OF BOARD ACTIONS.—The actions of 19 the Board relating to performing arts and to payments 20 made or directed to be made by the Board from any trust 21 funds shall not be subject to review by any officer or agen-22 cy other than a court of law.".

23 SEC. 5. REVIEWS, AUDITS, AND CLAIMS.

Section 6 of the John F. Kennedy Center Act (20
U.S.C. 76l) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (c) by striking "its" and in-2 serting "the Board's"; and

3 (2) by striking subsections (e) and (f) and in-4 serting the following:

"(d) AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS.—At least once every 3 5 years, the Comptroller General shall review and audit the 6 7 accounts of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts for the purpose of examining expenditures of 8 funds appropriated under authority provided by this Act. 9 "(e) INSPECTOR GENERAL.—The functions of the 10 Board funded by amounts appropriated pursuant to sec-11 tion 12 of this Act shall be subject to the requirements 12 of the Inspector General Act of 1978. The Inspector Gen-13 eral of the Smithsonian Institution is authorized to carry 14 15 out the requirements of such Act on behalf of the Board on a reimbursable basis. 16

17 "(f) PROPERTY AND PERSONNEL COMPENSATION.—

18 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Board may procure in-19 surance against any loss in connection with the 20 property of the Board and other assets administered by the Board. The Board's employees and volunteers 21 22 shall be deemed civil employees of the United States 23 within the meaning of the term 'employee' as defined in section 8101 of title 5, United States Code; ex-24 cept that the Board shall continue to provide bene-25

1 fits with respect to any disability or death resulting 2 from a personal injury to a nonappropriated fund employee of the Board sustained while in the per-3 4 formance of the employee's duties for the Board 5 pursuant to the workers compensation statute of the jurisdiction in which the John F. Kennedy Center 6 7 for the Performing Arts is located. Such disability or 8 death benefits, whether under such workers com-9 pensation statute or chapter 81 of title 5, United 10 States Code, shall continue to be the exclusive liabil-11 ity of the Board and the United States with respect 12 to all employees and volunteers of the Board.

"(2) FEDERAL TORT CLAIMS.—Notwithstanding
paragraph (1), no employee of the Board may bring
suit against the United States under the Federal
tort claims procedure of chapter 171 of title 28,
United States Code, for disability or death resulting
from personal injury sustained while in the performance of the employee's duties for the Board.

20 "(g) Settlements, Awards, and Judgments.— 21 Any settlement, award, or judgment made or entered into 22 pursuant to chapter 171 of title 28, United States Code, arising from any act or omission of an employee of 23 the Board of 24 in the performance а 25 nonappropriated fund activity shall be paid only from funds available to the Board for its performing arts activi ties.".

3 SEC. 6. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.

4 Section 10 of the John F. Kennedy Center Act (20
5 U.S.C. 76p) is amended—

6 (1) by striking "he" and inserting "the Sec-7 retary"; and

8 (2) by striking "his" and inserting "the Sec-9 retary's".

10 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

11 The John F. Kennedy Center Act (20 U.S.C. 76h–12 76q) is amended by adding at the end the following:

13 **"SEC. 12. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

"(a) MAINTENANCE, REPAIR, AND SECURITY.—
There is authorized to be appropriated to the Board
\$12,000,000 per fiscal year for each of fiscal years 1995
through 1999 to carry out subparagraph (H) of section
4(a)(1).

"(b) CAPITAL PROJECTS.—There is authorized to be
appropriated to the Board \$9,000,000 per fiscal year for
each of fiscal years 1995 through 1999 to carry out subparagraphs (F) and (G) of section 4(a)(1).

23 "(c) LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS.—No funds ap24 propriated pursuant to this section may be used for the
25 direct expenses incurred in the production of performing

arts attractions, or for personnel who are involved in per-1 forming arts administration (including supplies and equip-2 ment used by such personnel), or for production, staging, 3 4 public relations, marketing, fundraising, ticket sales, and education. However, funds appropriated directly to the 5 Board shall not affect nor diminish other Federal funds 6 7 sought for performing arts functions and may be used to reimburse the Board for that portion of costs that are 8 9 Federal costs reasonably allocated to building services and theater maintenance and repairs.". 10

11 SEC. 8. DEFINITIONS.

12 The John F. Kennedy Center Act (20 U.S.C. 76h–13 76q) is amended by adding at the end the following:

14 "SEC. 13. DEFINITIONS.

15 "For the purposes of this Act, the following defini-16 tions apply:

17 "(1) CAPITAL PROJECTS.—The term 'capital
18 projects' means capital repairs, replacements, im19 provements, rehabilitations, alterations, and modi20 fications to the existing features of the building and
21 site of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Perform22 ing Arts, including the theaters, garage, plaza, and
23 building walkways.

24 "(2) MAINTENANCE, REPAIR, AND SECURITY
25 SERVICES.—The term 'maintenance, repair, and se-

curity services' means all services and equipment necessary to maintain and operate the existing features of the building and site of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, including the theater, garage, plaza, and building walkways in a manner consistent with requirements for high quality operations.

8 "(3) Building and site of the john f. 9 KENNEDY CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS .--10 The terms 'building and site of the John F. Ken-11 nedy Center for the Performing Arts' and 'grounds 12 of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing 13 Arts' mean the site in the District of Columbia on 14 which the John F. Kennedy Center building is con-15 structed and which extends to the line of the west 16 face of the west retaining walls and curbs of the 17 Inner Loop Freeway on the east, the north face of 18 the north retaining walls and curbs of the Theodore 19 Roosevelt Bridge approaches on the south, the east 20 face of the east retaining walls and curbs of Rock Creek Parkway on the west, and the south curbs of 21 22 New Hampshire Avenue and F Street on the north, as generally depicted on the map entitled 'Transfer 23 24 of John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing 25 Arts', numbered 844/82563, and dated April 20,

1994, which shall be on file and available for public
 inspection in the office of the National Capital Re gion, National Park Service, Department of the In terior.".

5 SEC. 9. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

(a) AUTHORITY TO PRESCRIBE.—Section 5(a) of the
7 Act of October 24, 1951 (40 U.S.C. 193r) is amended—
8 (1) by striking "Institution and" and inserting
9 "Institution,"; and

10 (2) by inserting ", and the Trustees of the
11 John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts,"
12 after "National Gallery of Art".

13 (b) AUTHORITY TO SUSPEND.—Section 8 of such Act (40 U.S.C. 193u) is amended by striking "the Secretary 14 15 of the Smithsonian Institution or the Trustees of the National Gallery of Art or" each place it appears and insert-16 ing "the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, the 17 Trustees of the National Gallery of Art, the Trustees of 18 the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, or". 19 20 (c) BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS DEFINED.—Section 9 of such Act (40 U.S.C. 193v) is amended by adding at 21 22 the end the following:

23 "(3) The site of the John F. Kennedy Center
24 for the Performing Arts, which shall be held to ex25 tend to the line of the west face of the west retain-

ing walls and curbs of the Inner Loop Freeway on 1 2 the east, the north face of the north retaining walls 3 and curbs of the Theodore Roosevelt Bridge approaches on the south, the east face of the east re-4 taining walls and curbs of Rock Creek Parkway on 5 the west, and the south curbs of New Hampshire 6 7 Avenue and F Street on the north, as generally depicted on the map entitled 'Transfer of John F. 8 Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts', numbered 9 844/82563, and dated April 20, 1994, which shall be 10 on file and available for public inspection in the of-11 fice of the National Capital Region, National Park 12 Service, Department of the Interior.". 13 Passed the House of Representatives May 10, 1994.
