3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "John F. Kennedy Center
 5 Act Amendments of 1994".

15	Performing Arts;
16	"(E) provide within the John F. Kennedy
17	Center for the Performing Arts a suitable memo-
18	rial in honor of the late President;

20	prehensive building needs plan for the existing
21	features of the John F. Kennedy Center for the

24	projects at the John F. Kennedy Center for the

24	"(C) Use of agency personnel.—The
25	Board may utilize or employ the services of the

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1	personnel of any agency or instrumentality of
2	the Federal Government or the District of Co-
3	lumbia, with the consent of the agency or the in-
4	strumentality concerned, upon a reimbursable
5	basis, and utilize voluntary and uncompensated
6	personnel.
7	"(D) Selection of contractors.—In
8	carrying out its duties under this Act, the Board
9	may negotiate any contract for an environ-
10	mental system for, a protection system for, or a
11	repair to, maintenance of, or restoration of the
12	John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts
13	with selected contractors and award the contract

with selected contractors and award the contract on the basis of contractor qualifications as well as price.

"(E) MAINTENANCE OF HALLS.—The Board 16 shall maintain the Hall of Nations, the Hall of 17 States, and the Grand Foyer of the John F. Ken-18 nedy Center for the Performing Arts in a man-19 ner that is suitable to a national performing arts 20 center that is operated as a Presidential 21 memorial.". 22

spect to any disability or death resulting from a per-1 2 sonal injury to a nonappropriated fund employee of the Board sustained while in the performance of the 3 4 employee's duties for the Board pursuant to the workers compensation statute of the jurisdiction in which 5 the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts 6 7 is located. Such disability or death benefits, whether under such workers compensation statute or chapter 8 81 of title 5. "(b) CAPITAL PROJECTS.—There is authorized to be
appropriated to the Board \$9,000,000 per fiscal year for
each of fiscal years 1995 through 1999 to carry out subparagraphs (F) and (G) of section 4(a)(1).
