AN ACT

- To amend title 5, United States Code, to permit the garnishment of an annuity under the Civil Service Retirement System or the Federal Employees' Retirement System, if necessary to satisfy a judgment against an annuitant for physically, sexually, or emotionally abusing a child.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Child Abuse Account-3 ability Act".

4 SEC. 2. GARNISHMENT AUTHORITY.

5 (a) CIVIL SERVICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.—(1) Sec6 tion 8345(j)(1) of title 5, United States Code, is amended
7 to read as follows:

8 "(j)(1) Payments under this subchapter which would 9 otherwise be made to an employee, Member, or annuitant 10 based on service of that individual shall be paid (in whole 11 or in part) by the Office to another person if and to the 12 extent expressly provided for in the terms of—

"(A) any court decree of divorce, annulment, or
legal separation, or the terms of any court order or
court-approved property settlement agreement incident to any court decree of divorce, annulment, or
legal separation; or

"(B) any court order or other similar process in
the nature of garnishment for the enforcement of a
judgment rendered against such employee, Member,
or annuitant, for physically, sexually, or emotionally
abusing a child.

In the event that the Office is served with more than 1
decree, order, or other legal process with respect to the
same moneys due or payable to any individual, such moneys shall be available to satisfy such processes on a first-

come, first-served basis, with any such process being satis fied out of such moneys as remain after the satisfaction
 of all such processes which have been previously served.".

4 (2) Section 8345(j)(2) of title 5, United States Code,
5 is amended by inserting "other legal process," after
6 "order,".

7 (3) Section 8345(j)(3) of title 5, United States Code,
8 is amended to read as follows:

9 "(3) For the purpose of this subsection—

"(A) the term 'court' means any court of any 10 11 State, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth 12 of Puerto Rico, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, or the Virgin Islands, and any Indian court; 13 "(B) the term 'judgment rendered for phys-14 15 ically, sexually, or emotionally abusing a child' means any legal claim perfected through a final en-16 17 forceable judgment, which claim is based in whole or 18 in part upon the physical, sexual, or emotional abuse 19 of a child, whether or not that abuse is accompanied 20 by other actionable wrongdoing, such as sexual exploitation or gross negligence; and 21

22 ''(C) the term 'child' means an individual under23 18 years of age.''.

(b) FEDERAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.—
 (1) Section 8467(a) of title 5, United States Code, is
 amended to read as follows:

4 "(a) Payments under this chapter which would other-5 wise be made to an employee, Member, or annuitant (in-6 cluding an employee, Member, or annuitant as defined in 7 section 8331) based on service of that individual shall be 8 paid (in whole or in part) by the Office or the Executive 9 Director, as the case may be, to another person if and 10 to the extent expressly provided for in the terms of—

11 "(1) any court decree of divorce, annulment, or 12 legal separation, or the terms of any court order or 13 court-approved property settlement agreement inci-14 dent to any court decree of divorce, annulment, or 15 legal separation; or

16 "(2) any court order or other similar process in
17 the nature of garnishment for the enforcement of a
18 judgment rendered against such employee, Member,
19 or annuitant, for physically, sexually, or emotionally
20 abusing a child.

In the event that the Office or the Executive Director, as
the case may be, is served with more than 1 decree, order,
or other legal process with respect to the same moneys
due or payable to any individual, such moneys shall be
available to satisfy such processes on a first-come, first-

served basis, with any such process being satisfied out of
 such moneys as remain after the satisfaction of all such
 processes which have been previously served.".

4 (2) Section 8467(b) of title 5, United States Code,
5 is amended by inserting "other legal process," after
6 "order,".

7 (3) Section 8467 of title 5, United States Code, is8 amended by adding at the end the following:

9 "(c) For the purpose of this section—

"(1) the term 'judgment rendered for phys-10 ically, sexually, or emotionally abusing a child' 11 12 means any legal claim perfected through a final enforceable judgment, which claim is based in whole or 13 14 in part upon the physical, sexual, or emotional abuse 15 of a child, whether or not that abuse is accompanied by other actionable wrongdoing, such as sexual ex-16 17 ploitation or gross negligence; and

18 ''(2) the term 'child' means an individual under19 18 years of age.''.

(4) Section 8437(e)(3) of title 5, United States Code,
is amended by striking the period at the end of the first
sentence and inserting the following: "or relating to the
enforcement of a judgment for physically, sexually, or
emotionally abusing a child as provided under section
8467(a).".

1 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The amendments made by this Act shall take effect on the date of enactment of this Act, and shall apply with respect to any decree, order, or other legal process, or notice of agreement received by the Office of Personnel Management or the Executive Director of the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board on or after such date of enactment.
