## A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to provide that 5 additional points be granted, on the examination for entrance into the competitive service, to certain veterans who do not currently qualify for any such additional points.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       That section 3309 of title 5, United States Code, is  
4       amended—

5               (1) by inserting “(a)” before “A preference eli-  
6       gible”; and

1 (2) by adding at the end the following:

2 “(b)(1) Subject to paragraph (2), an individual who  
3 receives a passing grade in an examination for entrance  
4 into the competitive service is entitled to 5 additional  
5 points above such individual’s earned rating if such indi-  
6 vidual—

7 “(A) served on active duty as defined by section  
8 101(21) of title 38 at any time in the armed forces  
9 for a period totalling at least 24 months (not includ-  
10 ing service excluded under section 2108(1)(B)); and

11 “(B) has been separated from the armed forces  
12 under honorable conditions.

13 “(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply with respect to—

14 “(A) a preference eligible referred to in para-  
15 graph (1) or (2) of subsection (a); or

16 “(B) a retired member of the armed forces, un-  
17 less such retired member satisfies subparagraph (A)  
18 or (B) of section 2108(4).”.
