 - 3 That section 3309 of title 5, United States Code, is4 amended—
- 5 (1) by inserting "(a)" before "A preference eli6 gible"; and

(2) by adding at the end the following:
 "(b)(1) Subject to paragraph (2), an individual who
 receives a passing grade in an examination for entrance
 into the competitive service is entitled to 5 additional
 points above such individual's earned rating if such indi vidual—

"(A) served on active duty as defined by section 7 101(21) of title 38 at any time in the armed forces 8 for a period totalling at least 24 months (not includ-9 ing service excluded under section 2108(1)(B); and 10 "(B) has been separated from the armed forces 11 under honorable conditions. 12 "(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply with respect to— 13 "(A) a preference eligible referred to in para-14 graph (1) or (2) of subsection (a); or 15

16 "(B) a retired member of the armed forces, un17 less such retired member satisfies subparagraph (A)
18 or (B) of section 2108(4).".
