Entitled the "Volunteer Firefighter and Rescue Squad Worker Act".

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. FIREFIGHTER AND RESCUE SQUAD SERVICES.

4 Paragraph (4) of section 3(e) of the Fair Labor
5 Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 303(e)) is amended by
6 adding after subparagraph (B) the following:

7 "(C) The term 'employee' does not include a fire-8 fighter or a member of a rescue squad during the period 9 in which the firefighter or rescue squad member volunteers 10 the firefighter's or member's services at a location where 11 the firefighter or member is not employed.". 2

1 SEC. 2. WAIVER OF OVERTIME COMPENSATION.

2 The employer of a firefighter or member of a rescue 3 squad is not required to pay the firefighter or member 4 overtime compensation under section 7 of the Fair Labor 5 Standards Act of 1938 for a period—

6 (1) when the firefighter or member volunteered7 their services to the employer, and

8 (2) for which the firefighter or member signed9 a legally binding waiver of such compensation.

10 SEC. 3. COERCION.

11 Section 7 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 12 (29 U.S.C. 207) is amended by adding at the end the 13 following:

14 "(r) No employer may require (directly or indirectly) 15 an employee who is a firefighter or member of a rescue 16 squad to volunteer the employee's firefighting or rescue 17 squad services during any period in which such employee 18 would be entitled to receive compensation for overtime em-19 ployment under subsection (a) if section 3(e)(4)(C) was 20 not in effect.".
