## A BILL

To reform the grave marker allowance for veterans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. GRAVE MARKER ALLOWANCE.
- 4 (a) Reimbursement for Non-Government
- 5 Markers.—Section 2306 of title 38, United States Code,
- 6 is amended to by adding at the end thereof the following
- 7 new subsection:
- 8 "(e) In lieu of furnishing a headstone or marker
- 9 under subsection (a)(2) or (b) of this section, the Sec-
- 10 retary, in the Secretary's discretion, having due regard for
- 11 the circumstances in each case, may reimburse the person
- 12 entitled to request such headstone or marker for the actual

- 1 costs incurred by or on behalf of such person in (1) acquir-
- 2 ing a non-Government headstone or marker for placement
- 3 in any cemetery other than a national cemetery in connec-
- 4 tion with the burial or memorialization of the deceased
- 5 individual, and (2) lettering final dates on such headstones
- 6 or markers acquired while the individual is alive. Reim-
- 7 bursement under the preceding sentence may be made
- 8 only upon the request of the person entitled to request
- 9 the headstone or marker and may not be made in an
- 10 amount in excess of the average actual cost (not including
- 11 freight charges), as determined by the Secretary, of
- 12 headstones and markers furnished under subsections (a)
- 13 and (b) of this section.".
- 14 (b) Grave Liners.—Section 2306(d)(1) of such title
- 15 is amended by striking out "shall provide a grave liner
- 16 for each" and inserting in lieu thereof "may provide a
- 17 grave liner for any".
- 18 (c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 19 this section shall apply to deaths occurring on or after
- 20 November 1, 1994.
