### 103D CONGRESS 2D SESSION **H. R. 4074**

To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, and for other purposes.

Mr. HOYER (for himself, Mr. STUPAK, and Mr. LIGHTFOOT) introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Banking, Finance and Urban Affairs and Natural Resources

## A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Law Enforce-
- 5 ment Officers Memorial Coin Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.

7 (a) FIVE DOLLAR GOLD COINS.—The Secretary of 8 the Treasury (hereafter referred to as the "Secretary") shall issue not more than 200,000 five dollar coins, which
 shall—

3 (1) weigh 8.859 grams;

4 (2) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and

5 (3) contain 90 percent gold and 10 percent6 alloy.

7 (b) ONE DOLLAR SILVER COINS.—The Secretary
8 shall issue not more than 750,000 one dollar coins which
9 shall—

10 (1) weigh 26.73 grams;

11 (2) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and

12 (3) contain 90 percent silver and 10 percent13 copper.

14 (c) DESIGN.—The design of coins authorized to be 15 minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the National 16 Law Enforcement Officers Memorial. On each such coin 17 there shall be a designation of the value of the coin, an 18 inscription of the year "1994", and inscriptions of the 19 words "Liberty", "In God We Trust", "United States of 20 America", and "E Pluribus Unum".

(d) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins issued under this
Act shall be legal tender as provided in section 5103 of
title 31, United States Code.

(e) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of section
5132(a)(1) of title 31, United States Code, all coins mint-

ed under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic
 items.

#### 3 SEC. 3. SOURCES OF BULLION.

4 (a) GOLD.—The Secretary shall obtain gold for mint5 ing coins under this Act pursuant to the authority of the
6 Secretary under existing law.

7 (b) SILVER.—The Secretary shall obtain silver for
8 minting coins under this Act only from stockpiles estab9 lished under the Strategic and Critical Minerals Stock
10 Piling Act.

#### 11 SEC. 4. SELECTION OF DESIGN.

12 The design for each coin authorized by this Act shall13 be—

(1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
with the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., the Secretary of the Interior, and
the Commission of Fine Arts; and

18 (2) reviewed by the Citizens Commemorative19 Advisory Committee.

#### 20 SEC. 5. SALE OF COINS.

(a) SALE PRICE.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the coins issued under this Act shall be sold
by the Secretary at a price at least equal to the cost of
bullion, plus the cost of designing and issuing such coins

1 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, over-2 head expenses, marketing, and shipping).

3 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk4 sales at a reasonable discount.

5 (c) PREPAID ORDERS.—The Secretary shall accept 6 prepaid orders for the coins prior to the issuance of such 7 coins. Sales under this subsection shall be at a reasonable 8 discount.

9 (d) SURCHARGE REQUIRED.—All sales shall include 10 a surcharge of \$35 per coin for the five dollar coins and 11 \$7 per coin for the one dollar coins.

#### 12 SEC. 6. ISSUANCE OF THE COINS.

(a) PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE.—The coins authorized
under this Act shall be issued only through the end of calendar year 1994.

16 (b) PROOF AND UNCIRCULATED COINS.—The coins 17 authorized under this Act shall be issued in uncirculated 18 and proof qualities, and not more than 1 facility of the 19 United States Mint may be used to strike any particular 20 combination of denomination and quality.

21 SEC. 7. GENERAL WAIVER OF PROCUREMENT REGULA22 TIONS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
(b), no provision of law governing procurement or public
contracts shall be applicable to the procurement of goods

and services necessary for carrying out the provisions of
 this title.

3 (b) EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.—Sub-4 section (a) shall not relieve any person entering into a con-5 tract under the authority of this title from complying with 6 any law relating to equal employment opportunity.

#### 7 SEC. 8. DISTRIBUTION OF SURCHARGES.

8 The total amount of surcharges received by the Sec-9 retary from the sale of coins under this Act shall be 10 promptly paid by the Secretary to the Fund established 11 under section 11.

#### 12 SEC. 9. AUDITS.

The Comptroller General shall have the right to examine such books, records, documents, and other data of the National Park Service as may be related to the expenditure of amounts paid under section 8.

#### 17 SEC. 10. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

(a) NO COST TO THE GOVERNMENT.—The Secretary
shall take such actions as may be necessary to ensure that
the minting and issuance of the coins under this Act shall
not result in any net cost to the Federal Government.

(b) PAYMENT.—No coin shall be issued under thisAct unless the Secretary has received—

24 (1) full payment for the coin;

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(2) security satisfactory to the Secretary to in demnify the United States for full payment; or

3 (3) a guarantee of full payment satisfactory to
4 the Secretary from a depository institution the de5 posits of which are insured by the Federal Deposit
6 Insurance Corporation or the National Credit Union
7 Administration.

# 8 SEC. 11. NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MEMO9 RIAL MAINTENANCE FUND.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby established 10 the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Mainte-11 nance Fund (hereafter referred to as the "Fund"), which 12 shall be a revolving fund, to be administered by the Sec-13 retary of the Interior. Monies for the Fund shall be raised 14 15 through surcharges paid to the Fund pursuant to section 8. The Secretary of the Interior may accept donations for 16 the Fund. The Fund shall be maintained in an interest 17 bearing account within the Department of the Treasury. 18

19 (b) PURPOSES.—The Fund shall be used—

20 (1) for maintenance and repair of the National21 Law Enforcement Officers Memorial;

(2) to add to the Memorial the names of law
enforcement officers who have died in the line of
duty;

(3) for security of the Memorial site, to include 2 the posting of National Park Service rangers and United States Park Police, as appropriate;

4 (4) at the discretion of the Secretary of the Interior and in consultation with the Secretary of the 5 Treasury and the Attorney General of the United 6 7 States, who shall establish an equitable procedure between the Fund and such other organizations as 8 may be appropriate, to provide educational scholar-9 ships to the immediate family members of law en-10 forcement officers killed in the line of duty whose 11 12 names appear on the Memorial, the total amount of such scholarships not to exceed 10 percent of the 13 Fund's annual income: 14

(5) for the dissemination of information regard-15 16 ing the Memorial to the general public; and

17 (6) to administer the Fund, including contract-18 ing for necessary services, in an amount not to ex-19 ceed the lesser of—

20 (A) 10 percent of the Fund's annual in-21 come: or

(B) \$200,000 in any 1-year period.

(c) BUDGET AND AUDIT TREATMENT.—The Fund 23 shall be subject to the budget and audit provisions of chap-24 ter 91 of title 31, United States Code. 25

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
