To amend the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to provide grants for parents as teachers programs.

## A BILL

To amend the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to provide grants for parents as teachers programs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PARENTS AS TEACHERS PROGRAMS.
- 4 Title IV of the Elementary and Secondary Education
- 5 Act of 1965 is amended by inserting at the end the follow-
- 6 ing new part:
- 7 "Part G—Parents as Teachers
- **8 "SEC. 4701. SHORT TITLE.**
- 9 "This part may be cited as the 'Parents as Teachers:
- 10 the Family Involvement in Education Act of 1993'.

#### "SEC. 4702. FINDINGS.

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2	"The	Congress	finds—

- "(1) increased parental involvement in the education of their children appears to be the key to long-term gains for youngsters;
- 6 "(2) providing seed money is an appropriate 7 role for the Federal Government to play in edu-8 cation;
  - "(3) children participating in the parents as teachers program in Missouri are found to have increased cognitive or intellectual skills, language ability, social skills and other predictors of school success;
- 14 "(4) most early childhood programs begin at 15 age 3 or 4 when remediation may already be nec-16 essary; and
- 17 "(5) many children receive no health screening 18 between birth and the time they enter school, thus 19 such children miss the opportunity of having devel-20 opmental delays detected early.

#### 21 "SEC. 4703. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.

- 22 "It is the purpose of this part to encourage States
- 23 to develop and expand parent and early childhood edu-
- 24 cation programs in an effort to—

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1	"(1) increase parents' knowledge of and con-
2	fidence in child-rearing activities, such as teaching
3	and nurturing their young children;
4	"(2) strengthen partnerships between parents
5	and schools; and
6	"(3) enhance the developmental progress of
7	participating children.
8	"SEC. 4704. DEFINITIONS.
9	"For the purposes of this part—
10	"(1) the term 'developmental screening' means
11	the process of measuring the progress of children to
12	determine if there are problems or potential prob-
13	lems or advanced abilities in the areas of under-
14	standing and use of language, perception through
15	sight, perception through hearing, motor develop-
16	ment and hand-eye coordination, health, and phys-
17	ical development;
18	"(2) the term 'eligible family' means any parent
19	with one or more children between birth and 3 years
20	of age, or any parent expecting a child;
21	"(3) the term 'lead agency' means the office or
22	agency in a State designated by the Governor to ad-
23	minister the parents as teachers program authorized

by this part;

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"(4) the term 'parent education' includes parent support activities, the provision of resource materials on child development and parent-child learning activities, private and group educational guidance, individual and group learning experiences for the parent and child, and other activities that enable the parent to improve learning in the home;

"(5) the term 'parent educator' means a person hired by the lead agency of a State or designated by local entities who administers group meetings, home visits and developmental screening for eligible families, and is trained by the Parents As Teachers National Center established under section 4708; and

"(6) the term 'Secretary' means the Secretary of Education.

#### 16 "SEC. 4705. PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.

17 "(a) IN GENERAL.—

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- "(1) The Secretary is authorized to make grants to States to pay the Federal share of the cost of establishing, expanding, and operating parents as teachers programs.
  - "(2) In awarding grants under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall give special consideration to applicants whose programs primarily serve hard-toserve populations, including—

1	"(A) teenaged parents,
2	"(B) illiterate parents,
3	"(C) economically disadvantaged parents,
4	"(D) offenders and their families,
5	"(E) unemployed parents,
6	"(F) learning disabled parents, and
7	"(G) non-English speaking parents.
8	"(3) In determining the amount of a grant
9	under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall take into
10	consideration the size of the population to be served,
11	the size of the area to be served, and the financial
12	resources of such population and area.
13	"(b) Special Rule.—Any State operating a parents
14	as teachers program which is associated with the Parents
15	As Teachers National Center located in St. Louis, Mis-
16	souri, shall be eligible to receive a grant under this part.
17	"SEC. 4706. PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS.
18	"(a) In General.—(1) Each State receiving a grant
19	under section 4705(a) shall conduct a parents as teachers
20	program which—
21	"(A) establishes and operates parent education
22	programs including programs of developmental
23	screening of children; and
24	"(B) designates a lead State agency which
25	shall—

1	(1) nire parent educators who have had
2	supervised experience in the care and education
3	of children;
4	"(ii) establish the number of group meet-
5	ings and home visits required to be provided
6	each year for each participating family, with a
7	minimum of 4 group meetings and 8 home vis-
8	its for each participating family;
9	"(iii) be responsible for administering the
10	periodic screening of participating children's
11	educational, hearing and visual development,
12	using the Denver Developmental Test, Zimmer-
13	man Preschool Language Scale, or other ap-
14	proved screening instruments; and
15	"(iv) develop recruitment and retention
16	programs for hard-to-reach populations.
17	"(2) Grants awarded section 4705(a) shall only be
18	used for parents as teachers programs which serve families
19	during the period of time beginning with the last 3 months
20	of a mother's pregnancy and ending when a child attains
21	the age of 3.
22	"SEC. 4707. PARENTS AS TEACHERS NATIONAL CENTER.
23	"The Secretary shall establish a Parents As Teachers
24	National Center to disseminate information to, and pro-

- 1 vide technical and training assistance to, States establish-
- 2 ing and operating parents as teachers programs.
- **3 "SEC. 4708. EVALUATIONS.**
- 4 "The Secretary shall complete an evaluation of the
- 5 State parents as teachers programs within 4 years from
- 6 the date of enactment of this part.
- 7 "SEC. 4709. APPLICATION.
- 8 "Each State desiring a grant under section 4705(a)
- 9 shall submit an application to the Secretary at such time,
- 10 in such manner and accompanied by such information as
- 11 the Secretary may reasonably require. Each such applica-
- 12 tion shall describe the activities and services for which as-
- 13 sistance is sought.
- 14 "SEC. 4710. PAYMENTS AND FEDERAL SHARE.
- 15 "(a) Payments.—The Secretary shall pay to each
- 16 State having an application approved under section 4709
- 17 the Federal share of the cost of the activities described
- 18 in the application.
- 19 "(b) FEDERAL SHARE.—(1) The Federal share—
- 20 "(A) for the first year for which a State re-
- ceives assistance under this part shall be 100 per-
- cent;
- "(B) for the second such year shall be 100 per-
- cent:

- 1 "(C) for the third such year shall be 75 per-
- 2 cent;
- 3 "(D) for the fourth such year shall be 50 per-
- 4 cent; and
- 5 "(E) for the fifth such year 25 percent.
- 6 "(2) The non-Federal share of payments under this
- 7 part may be in cash or in kind fairly evaluated, including
- 8 planned equipment or services.
- 9 "SEC. 4711. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 10 "There are authorized to be appropriated
- 11 \$20,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 1993, 1994, 1995,
- 12 1996, and 1997 to carry out this Act.".

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
