A BILL

To develop a program regarding career opportunities by making such information available on publicly accessible networks and other electronic media.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Career Awareness
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. CAREER INFORMATION AVAILABILITY.
- 7 (a) PROGRAM.—The Secretary of Education, in con-
- 8 sultation with the Secretary of Labor, shall develop an age
- 9 specific program for students from kindergarten through

- 1 12th grade regarding career opportunities and the skills
 2 necessary to pursue such careers.
 3 (b) DEADLINE.—Not later than one year after the
 4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall de-
- 5 velop and make available the program described in sub-
- 6 section (a).

7 SEC. 2. INFORMATION NETWORK.

- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Education shall,
- 9 to the maximum extent practicable, coordinate with other
- 10 Federal agencies and specifically with local educational
- 11 agencies to make available the program developed pursu-
- 12 ant to section 2 on publicly accessible networks and other
- 13 electronic media.

- 14 (b) CURRENT INFORMATION AND DISSEMINATION.—
- 15 The Secretary of Education shall—
- (1) regularly update the age specific programsregarding career opportunities;
 - (2) use reasonable means to notify other Federal agencies and local educational agencies regarding the availability of such information; and
- 21 (3) create and ensure currency in the dissemi-22 nation of the career information.
