### 103D CONGRESS 2D SESSION H. R. 4971

To amend the Animal Welfare Act to strengthen the annual reporting requirements of research facilities conducting animal experimentation or testing and to improve the accountability of animal experimentation programs of the Department of Defense.

## A BILL

- To amend the Animal Welfare Act to strengthen the annual reporting requirements of research facilities conducting animal experimentation or testing and to improve the accountability of animal experimentation programs of the Department of Defense.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Animal Experimen-
- 5 tation Right To Know Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds the following:

1 (1) Over 21,000,000 animals are used every 2 year in laboratory experiments and tests conducted 3 by research facilities subject to the Animal Welfare 4 Act (7 U.S.C. 2131 et seq.), and many of these ex-5 periments and tests are painful, distressful and 6 cause permanent injury or death to the animals.

7 (2) In addition to animal experimentation and
8 testing conducted by private research facilities, the
9 Federal Government spends over \$5,000,000,000
10 annually on experiments and tests involving the use
11 of animals.

(3) The Federal Government must bear the responsibility for making information on animal experimentation complete, coherent, and readily accessible to the American public.

(4) While the Department of Agriculture currently requires all registered research facilities conducting animal research to file an annual report, the
compilation of these reports fails to provide comprehensive annual profiles of laboratory animal use
in the United States.

(5) The Department of Defense conducts almost \$200,000,000 worth of animal testing every
year and has not provided detailed information on
its experimentation programs.

1	(6) Military researchers receive Federal funding
2	for tests involving animals without being subject to
3	the same review process as other researchers in the
4	scientific community.
5	SEC. 3. RESEARCH FACILITIES ANNUAL REPORT REGARD-
6	ING ANIMAL EXPERIMENTATION AND TEST-
7	ING.
8	(a) Additional Elements of Report.—Sub-
9	section (a)(7)(B) of section 13 of the Animal Welfare Act
10	(7 U.S.C. 2143) is amended—
11	(1) by striking ''and'' at the end of clause (ii);
12	(2) by striking the period at the end of clause
13	(iii) and inserting "; and"; and
14	(3) by adding at the end the following new
15	clauses:
16	''(iv) information regarding where animals used
17	by such facility were obtained;
18	''(v) an accurate count of all animals of all spe-
19	cies used in animal experimentation testing, includ-
20	ing rats, mice, birds and other animals; and
21	''(vi) information regarding the general pur-
22	poses of the animal experimentation program of
23	such facility, including whether the animals were
24	used in the fields of research, testing, or edu-
25	cation.".

(b) AVAILABILITY OF CERTAIN REPORT INFORMA TION.—Subsection (a)(7) of such section is amended by
 adding at the end the following new subparagraph:

4 "(C) The Secretary shall develop a system for releas5 ing to the public information derived from subparagraph
6 (B)(iv) regarding where animals used in research are ob7 tained.".

# 8 SEC. 4. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE ANIMAL EXPERIMEN9 TATION PROGRAMS.

10 (a) SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DEFENSE RE11 SEARCH FACILITIES.—Section 14 of the Animal Welfare
12 Act (7 U.S.C. 2144) is amended—

13 (1) by inserting "(a) IN GENERAL.—" after
14 "SEC. 14."; and

15 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-16 section:

17 "(b) Special Requirements for Department of DEFENSE.—(1) The Secretary of Defense shall submit an 18 annual report to Congress on the animal experimentation 19 programs of the Department of Defense. The report shall 20 provide in-depth profiles of animal research (including 21 22 testing, education and training) conducted at each Department research facility. To the greatest extent possible, 23 such report should be filed as an unclassified document. 24 "(2) The annual report shall include the following: 25

"(A) Initiatives to promote alternative research
 methods that would phase out and reduce the use of
 animals in research.

4 "(B) Procedures adopted to prevent unintended5 duplication of research.

6 "(C) The total cost of the animal-based re-7 search in comparison to other forms of biological re-8 search conducted by the research facilities, each 9 military department, and the Department of Defense 10 as a whole.

"(3) The Secretary of Defense shall establish programs to phase out and replace current uses of animals
at research facilities of the Department of Defense, in accordance with the initiatives identified under paragraph
(2)(A).

"(4) The Secretary of Defense shall appoint an ombudsman for animal issues at each research facility of the
Department of Defense. The purpose of this individual
would be to field and act on any complaints and concerns
about the facility's animal care and use program.

21 "(5) The Secretary of Defense shall submit an annual
22 report to the Secretary of Agriculture in accordance with
23 section 13(a)(7).

24 "(6) The Secretary of Defense may submit a waiver25 form in place of any information regarding animal tests

that the Secretary of Defense determines cannot be pub licly disclosed for reasons of national security.".

3 (b) REVIEW OF DEFENSE ANIMAL EXPERIMEN-TATION PROGRAMS.—The President shall appoint an 11 4 member panel of biomedical experts and animal care ex-5 perts to investigate the animal use and care programs of 6 the Department of Defense. At the direction of the Presi-7 dent, the panel shall examine the ethics and regulation of 8 the number and types of animal experiments conducted 9 by the Department of Defense. 10
