A BILL

To limit the duration of payments of expenses of former Speakers of the House of Representatives.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON THE DURATION OF PAYMENTS

4 **OF EXPENSES OF FORMER SPEAKERS OF THE** 5 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.**

6 The period for which expenses of former Speakers of 7 the House of Representatives may be paid shall end 3 years after the date of the expiration of the term of office
as Representative of the former Speaker involved, except
that, in the case of a former Speaker who is receiving such
expenses on the date of the enactment of this Act, the
period shall end 3 years after the date of the enactment
of this Act.

7 SEC. 2. DEFINITION.

As used in section 1, the term "expenses of former 9 Speakers of the House of Representatives" means the of-10 fice, allowance, and other expenses provided for former 11 Speakers of the House of Representatives under House 12 Resolution 1238, Ninety-first Congress, enacted into per-13 manent law by chapter VIII of the Supplemental Appro-14 priations Act, 1971 (2 U.S.C. 31b–1 et seq.).
