Mr. HENRY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

A BILL

To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to provide for a House of Representatives election limitation on contributions from persons other than local individual residents.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ELECTION LIMI-**

4 **TATION ON CONTRIBUTIONS FROM PERSONS**

5 **OTHER THAN LOCAL INDIVIDUAL RESIDENTS.**

6 Section 315 of the Federal Election Campaign Act

7 of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 441a) is amended by adding at the end

8 the following new subsection:

1 “(i)(1) A candidate for the office of Representative
2 in, or Delegate or Resident Commissioner to, the Congress
3 may not, with respect to a reporting period for an election,
4 accept contributions from persons other than local individ-
5 ual residents totaling in excess of the total of contributions
6 accepted from local individual residents.

7 “(2) As used in this subsection, the term ‘local indi-
8 vidual resident’ means an individual who resides in the
9 congressional district involved.”.
