 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- 4 The Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) The dietary patterns of Americans do not 6 result in nutrient intakes that fully meet Rec-7 ommended Dietary Allowances (RDAs) of vitamins 8 and minerals.

(2) The elderly often fail to achieve adequate
 nutrient intakes from diet alone.

3 (3) Pregnant women have particularly high nu4 trient needs, which they often fail to meet through
5 dietary means alone.

6 (4) Many scientific studies have shown that nu-7 tritional supplements contain folic acid (a B vitamin) can prevent a large proportion (as many as 70 8 9 to 80 percent) of neural tube birth defects and the 10 Public Health Service, in September 1992, rec-11 ommended that "all women of childbearing age in the United States who are capable of becoming preg-12 nant should consume 0.4 mg of folic acid per day for 13 14 the purpose of reducing their risk of having a preg-15 nancy affected with spina bifida or other neural tube birth defects." 16

17 (5) Infants who fail to receive adequate intakes
18 of iron may be somewhat impaired in their mental
19 and behavioral development.

20 (6) Children in low-income families often fail to21 achieve nutritional goals from diet alone.

(7) A massive volume of evidence strongly suggests that increasing intake of specific nutrients over
an extended period of time may be helpful in pro-
