Mr. Regula introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To provide for the relief of hospitals treating rural populations under the current calculation of the wage index modifier for the prospective payment under Medicare.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
That section 1886 of the Social Security Act of 1935 (42
U.S.C. 1395ww(d)(3)(E)) is amended by adding the following new paragraph at the end thereof:

"(F) Not later than October 1, 1995, and
ending October 1, 1996, the Secretary shall update the factor under this subparagraph for

each hospital in a rural area, or at the request

of a hospital in an urban area whose wage index is not greater than .06 of the wage index for rural areas of such State and which demonstrates its net inpatient care revenues from rural areas during prior five fiscal years exceed 20 percent of its total of such net inpatient care revenues during the same period, for such hospital by an added amount of not less than .05, nor greater than .10, in proportion to the ratio of current total wages and wage-related costs of the hospital to such costs at the time of their last adjustment.".
