SEC. 2. CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH CHILD SUP PORT OBLIGATIONS REQUIRED AS A CONDI TION OF RECEIVING FEDERAL FINANCIAL AS SISTANCE.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an agency or instrumentality of the Federal 6 7 Government may not provide financial assistance to an ap-8 plicant therefor unless the agency or instrumentality has 9 obtained from the applicant a certification that the applicant is not more than 60 days delinquent in the payment 10 of any child support obligation imposed by a court or an 11 order of an administrative process established under State 12 law, or if so delinquent, is in compliance with a plan or 13 agreement entered into between the applicant and the per-14 son to whom the payment is to be made or a State provid-15 ing services to the person with respect to the collection 16 of the support. 17

18 (b) REGULATIONS.—Within 6 months after the date 19 of the enactment of this section, each agency or instru-20 mentality of the Federal Government that provides finan-21 cial assistance shall prescribe such regulations as may be 22 necessary to comply with subsection (a).
