A BILL

To remove the restrictions on the export of Alaskan North Slope oil.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. EXPORT ADMINISTRATION ACT AMENDMENT.

4 Section 7(d) of the Export Administration Act of

5 1979 (50 U.S.C. 2406(d)) is hereby repealed.

6 SEC. 2. OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW.

7 The export of domestically produced crude oil trans-8 ported by pipeline over right-of-way granted pursuant to 9 section 203 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization 10 Act (43 U.S.C. 1652) shall not be subject to the restrictions contained in section 28(u) of the Mineral Leasing
Act of 1920 (30 U.S.C. 185), section 103 of the Energy
Policy and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C. 6212), section 28
of the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C.
1354), or section 7430(e) of title 10, United States Code,
or any regulations issued under any such provision of law.
