A BILL

- To prohibit activities other than certain required environmental or oceanographic studies under the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act within the outer continental shelf off the State of Florida, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION OF ACTIVITIES OTHER THAN EN-2 VIRONMENTAL OR OCEANOGRAPHIC STUD-3 IES. 4 (a) PROHIBITION.—The Secretary of the Interior (in this Act referred to as the "Secretary") shall not— 5 6 (1) conduct a lease sale; or 7 (2) issue any new leases, 8 in any area of the outer continental shelf off the State 9 of Florida, between the seaward lateral boundary between Florida and Alabama and the seaward lateral boundary 10 between Florida and Georgia. 11 12 (b) EFFECTIVE PERIOD.—(1) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall remain in effect until the later of— 13 14 (A) January 1, 2002; or 15 (B) 180 days after the date on which the Sec-16 retary submits to the Congress and to the Governor of the State of Florida a report documenting the 17 18 completion of the studies described in subsection (c). 19 (2) Each study that is documented in a report de-20 scribed in paragraph (1)(B) shall be reviewed, before submission of the report, by at least 3 scientists who— 21 22 (A) shall be nominated by the Florida Academy of Sciences, and approved by the Secretary and the 23 Governor of the State of Florida: 24 (B) are not employees of the Department of the 25 26 Interior: and

(C) are well qualified in the scientific disciplines
 required for performance of the particular study or
 studies that they review.

4 (3) A report described in paragraph (1)(B) shall in5 clude each reviewer's written evaluations of each study's
6 methodology and results.

7 (c) STUDIES.—The Secretary shall undertake, directly or by contract, ecological and socioeconomic studies, 8 9 physical oceanographic studies, endangered and threatened species and marine mammal surveys, and other envi-10 ronmental studies, including fieldwork and correlation of 11 existing data and information, sufficient to obtain infor-12 mation about all significant conditions, processes, re-13 sources, and environments that may influence or be influ-14 15 enced by any of the activities described in subsection (a).

16 SEC. 2. CANCELLATION OF LEASES.

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 10 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall com-18 mence the process of canceling, and thereafter shall pro-19 ceed with dispatch to cancel, all leases in the area south 20 of 26 degrees north latitude and east of 86 degrees west 21 22 longitude that were issued under the Outer Continental 23 Shelf Lands Act on or before the date of enactment of this Act. 24

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1 (b) ANNUAL REPORT.—The Secretary shall submit 2 a report to Congress annually, on the anniversary of the 3 date of enactment of this Act, on the status of the can-4 cellation proceedings, until all of the leases described in 5 subsection (a) have been canceled.

6 SEC. 3. COMPENSATION.

(a) AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION.—For any lease that
is canceled pursuant to section 2, to the extent that it is
determined that the lessee is entitled to compensation, the
lessee shall receive compensation as provided in section
5(a)(2)(C) of the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43
U.S.C. 1334(a)(2)(C)).

(b) PAYMENT BY THE UNITED STATES.—All of the
compensation to which a lessee may be entitled under subsection (a) shall be paid out of the Treasury of the United
States, and the State of Florida shall incur no cost or
other liability of any kind as a consequence of cancellation
of any lease under this Act.

19 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

There are authorized to be appropriated \$1,000,000 for each of fiscal years 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001, for the purpose of conducting or contracting for performance of the studies required by section 1(c), to remain available until expended.

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
