A BILL

To terminate all United States assistance to the National Endowment for Democracy, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF ASSISTANCE TO THE NA-

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TIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR DEMOCRACY.

5 (a) REPEAL OF NED ACT.—The National Endow6 ment for Democracy Act (22 U.S.C. 4411 et seq.) is here7 by repealed.

8 (b) PROHIBITION ON ASSISTANCE TO NED.—Funds9 may not be expended by any department, agency, or in-

strumentality of the United States for grants or any other
assistance for the National Endowment for Democracy.

3 (c) FINAL AUDIT BY GAO.—The Comptroller Gen-4 eral of the United States shall conduct an audit with re-5 spect to any funds, not previously audited by the Comptroller General, granted by the United States Government 6 7 to the National Endowment for Democracy and shall submit a report of that audit to the Congress. The audit shall 8 be conducted in accordance with, and under the conditions 9 set forth in, section 504 of the National Endowment for 10 Democracy Act (22 U.S.C. 4413). 11

12 (d) FREEDOM OF INFORMATION.—Notwithstanding 13 subsection (a), section 506 of the National Endowment 14 for Democracy Act (22 U.S.C. 4415) shall continue to 15 apply with respect to any funds received by the National 16 Endowment for Democracy from the United States Gov-17 ernment on or before the date of enactment of this Act.

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
