## **RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding religious intolerance.

Whereas the rights, liberties, and freedoms enumerated in the Constitution of the United States are guaranteed to all citizens regardless of their religious beliefs or affiliations; and

Whereas individuals of all religious denominations have made substantial contributions to the establishment, preservation, and protection of the system of government of the Nation: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved, That—*

2               (1) the House of Representatives strongly op-  
3       poses anti-Christian bigotry and all other forms of  
4       religious intolerance and condemns all manifesta-  
5       tions and expressions of religious bigotry and intoler-  
6       erance;

7               (2) the House condemns individuals and organi-  
8       zations that foster intolerance, suspicion, hatred, or  
9       fear of individuals who—

10              (A) hold values rooted in religious tenets;

11              (B) participate in the political process to  
12       ensure that the laws of the Nation reflect such  
13       values; and

14              (C) advocate public policies that are re-  
15       spectful of such values; and

16              (3) it shall be the policy of the House to seek  
17       to ensure that the rights of individuals to participate  
18       in the political process of the Nation are not in-  
19       fringed on the basis of their religious beliefs or  
20       affiliations.
