## **RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the cost-of-living adjustment provisions under title II of the Social Security Act should be preserved.

Whereas the social security cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) was authorized by the Congress in 1972 so that recipients' benefits could keep up with the ever-rising cost of keeping modest means;

Whereas the annual COLA is based on the Consumer Price Index as determined by the Department of Labor;

Whereas social security is off budget and thus should be free from political considerations;

- Whereas the social security trust funds currently total over \$300,000,000, guaranteeing that retirees will continue to receive funds well into the next century;
- Whereas a freeze on the COLA would affect all 48,000,000 social security beneficiaries, including children and disabled individuals;
- Whereas 500,000 senior citizens would fall under the poverty line in the event of such a freeze;
- Whereas a COLA freeze is compounded year after year, never to be recouped by the recipient;
- Whereas that senior citizens cannot afford to be without much-needed funds in this current economic climate;
- Whereas elderly social security beneficiaries already have \$1 of every \$3 earned over \$10,560 taken away due to the social security earnings test; and
- Whereas the notch problem also substantially reduces millions of senior citizens' retirement checks: Now, therefore, be it

  - 2 resentatives that the provisions of section 215(i) of the
  - 3 Social Security Act providing for cost-of-living adjust-
  - 4 ments under the old-age, survivors, and disability insur-
  - 5 ance program under title II of such Act are essential to
  - 6 the integrity of such program and must not be interrupted
  - 7 or restricted.
