

# AMENDMENTS

# In the House of Representatives, U. S.,

November 21, 1993.

*Resolved,* That the bill from the Senate (S. 1284) entitled "An Act to amend the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act to expand or modify certain provisions relating to programs for individuals with developmental disabilities, Federal assistance for priority area activities for individuals with developmental disabilities, protection and advocacy of individual rights, university affiliated programs, and projects of national significance, and for other purposes", do pass with the following

## **AMENDMENTS:**

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert:

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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
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2 This Act may be cited as the "Developmental Disabil3 ities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act Amendments of
4 1993".

5 SEC. 2. TITLE AND PART HEADINGS.

6 (a) TITLE.—The heading of title I of the Developmen-

7 tal Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C.

8 6000 et seq.) is amended to read as follows:

# *"TITLE I—PROGRAMS FOR INDI- VIDUALS WITH DEVELOPMEN- TAL DISABILITIES".*

4 (b) PART.—The heading of part A of title I of the De5 velopmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act
6 (42 U.S.C. 6000 et seq.) is amended to read as follows:

7 "PART A—GENERAL PROVISIONS".

### 8 SEC. 3. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

9 Section 101 of the Developmental Disabilities Assist-10 ance and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6000) is amended 11 to read as follows:

### 12 "SEC. 101. FINDINGS, PURPOSES, AND POLICY.

13 *"(a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds that—* 

14 "(1) in 1993 there are more than 3,000,000
15 individuals with developmental disabilities in the
16 United States;

17 *"(2) disability is a natural part of the human* experience that does not diminish the right of individ-18 19 uals with developmental disabilities to enjoy the op-20 portunity to live independently, enjoy self-determina-21 tion, make choices, contribute to society, and experience full integration and inclusion in the economic, 22 23 political, social, cultural, and educational mainstream of American society; 24

1	"(3) individuals with developmental disabilities
2	continually encounter various forms of discrimination
3	in critical areas;
4	"(4) there is a lack of public awareness of the ca-
5	pabilities and competencies of individuals with devel-
6	opmental disabilities;
7	"(5) individuals whose disabilities occur during
8	their developmental period frequently have severe dis-
9	abilities that are likely to continue indefinitely;
10	"(6) individuals with developmental disabilities
11	often require lifelong specialized services and assist-
12	ance, provided in a coordinated and culturally com-
13	petent manner by many agencies, professionals, advo-
14	cates, community representatives, and others to elimi-
15	nate barriers and to meet the needs of such individ-
16	uals and their families;
17	"(7) a substantial portion of individuals with
18	developmental disabilities and their families do not
19	have access to appropriate support and services from
20	generic and specialized service systems and remain
21	unserved or underserved;
22	"(8) family members, friends, and members of
23	the community can play an important role in en-
24	hancing the lives of individuals with developmental
25	disabilities, especially when the family and commu-

1	nity are provided with the necessary services and sup-
2	ports; and
3	"(9) the goals of the Nation properly include the
4	goal of providing individuals with developmental dis-
5	abilities with the opportunities and support to—
6	"(A) make informed choices and decisions;
7	"(B) live in homes and communities in
8	which such individuals can exercise their full
9	rights and responsibilities as citizens;
10	"(C) pursue meaningful and productive
11	lives;
12	"(D) contribute to their family, community,
13	State, and Nation;
14	"(E) have interdependent friendships and
15	relationships with others; and
16	"(F) achieve full integration and inclusion
17	in society;
18	in an individualized manner, consistent with unique
19	strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, abilities and
20	capabilities of each individual.
21	"(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to assure
22	that individuals with developmental disabilities and their
23	families have access to culturally competent services, sup-
24	ports, and other assistance and opportunities that promote

independence, productivity, and integration and inclusion
 into the community, through—

3 "(1) support to State Developmental Disabilities 4 Councils in each State to promote, through systemic 5 change, capacity building, and advocacy (consistent 6 with section 101(c)(2), a consumer and family-cen-7 tered, comprehensive system, and a coordinated array of services, supports, and other assistance for individ-8 uals with developmental disabilities and their fami-9 lies: 10

"(2) support to protection and advocacy systems
in each State to protect the legal and human rights
of individuals with developmental disabilities;

''(3) support to university affiliated programs to
provide interdisciplinary preservice preparation of
students and fellows, community service activities,
and the dissemination of information and research
findings; and

"(4) support to national initiatives to collect
necessary data, provide technical assistance to State
Developmental Disabilities Councils, protection, and
advocacy systems and university affiliated programs,
and support other nationally significant activities.

24 "(c) POLICY.—It is the policy of the United States that
25 all programs, projects, and activities receiving assistance

under this Act shall be carried out in a manner consistent
 with the principles that—

3 "(1) individuals with developmental disabilities, including those with the most severe developmental 4 5 disabilities, are capable of achieving independence, productivity, and integration and inclusion into the 6 7 community, and the provision of services, supports and other assistance can improve such individuals' 8 ability to achieve independence, productivity, and in-9 tegration and inclusion; 10

11 "(2) individuals with developmental disabilities 12 and their families have competencies, capabilities and 13 personal goals that should be recognized, supported, 14 and encouraged and any assistance should be pro-15 vided in an individualized manner, consistent with 16 the unique strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, 17 abilities, and capabilities of the individual;

18 "(3) individuals with developmental disabilities
19 and their families are the primary decisionmakers re20 garding the services and supports such individuals
21 and their families receive and play decisionmaking
22 roles in policies and programs that affect the lives of
23 such individuals and their families;

24 "(4) services, supports, and other assistance are
25 provided in a manner that demonstrates respect for

individual dignity, personal preferences, and cultural
 differences;

3 "(5) communities accept and support individ4 uals with developmental disabilities and are enriched
5 by the full and active participation and the contribu6 tions by individuals with developmental disabilities
7 and their families; and

8 "(6) individuals with developmental disabilities 9 have opportunities and the necessary support to be 10 included in community life, have interdependent rela-11 tionships, live in homes and communities, and make 12 contributions to their families, community, State, and 13 Nation.".

### 14 SEC. 4. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.

(a) PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY OF THE RIGHTS OF
INDIVIDUALS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.—The
heading of part C of title I of the Developmental Disabilities
Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6041 et seq.)
is amended to read as follows:

20 "PART C—PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY OF THE
21 RIGHTS OF INDIVIDUALS WITH DEVEL22 OPMENTAL DISABILITIES".

(b) SYSTEM REQUIRED.—Section 142 of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (42)

U.S.C. 6042) is amended by adding at the end the following
 subsection:

"(i) Public Notice of Federal Onsite Review.— 3 The Secretary shall provide advance public notice of any 4 Federal programmatic and administrative review and so-5 licit public comment on the system funded under this part 6 through such notice. The findings of the public comment so-7 licitation notice shall be included in the onsite visit report. 8 The results of such reviews shall be distributed to the Gov-9 ernor of the State and to other interested public and private 10 11 parties.".

12 (c) DEFINITION REGARDING UNIVERSITY AFFILIATED 13 PROGRAMS.—The Developmental Disabilities Assistance 14 and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6000 et seq.) is amend-15 ed—

16 (1) in section 102(1)—

- 17 (A) by inserting '', except as provided in
  18 section 155, " before ''includes''; and
- 19 (B) by inserting "the Commonwealth of" be-
- 20 fore "Puerto Rico"; and
- 21 (2) by adding at the end of part D the following22 section:

1 "SEC. 155. DEFINITION.

2 "For purposes of this part, the term 'State' means each
3 of the several States, the District of Columbia, the Common4 wealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Guam.".

### 5 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS.

6 (a) PLANNING OF PRIORITY AREA ACTIVITIES.—Sec-7 tion 130 of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and 8 Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6030) is amended by striking 9 "\$77,400,000" and all that follows and inserting the follow-10 ing: "\$70,000,000 for fiscal year 1994, and such sums as 11 may be necessary for each of the fiscal years 1995 and 12 1996.".

(b) PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY OF INDIVIDUAL
RIGHTS.—Section 143 of the Developmental Disabilities
Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6043) is
amended by striking "\$24,200,000" and all that follows and
inserting the following: "\$24,000,000 for fiscal year 1994,
and such sums as may be necessary for each of the fiscal
years 1995 and 1996.".

(c) UNIVERSITY AFFILIATED PROGRAM.—Section 154
of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of
Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6064) is amended to read as follows:

### 23 *"SEC. 154. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.*

24 "For the purpose of making grants under subsections
25 (a) through (e) of section 152, there are authorized to be
26 appropriated \$19,000,000 for fiscal year 1994, and such
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sums as may be necessary for each of the fiscal years 1995
 and 1996.".

3 (d) PROJECTS OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE.—Section 4 163(a) of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and 5 Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6083(a)) is amended by strik-6 ing "\$3,650,000" and all that follows and inserting the fol-7 lowing: "\$4,000,000 for fiscal year 1994, and such sums 8 as may be necessary for each of the fiscal years 1995 and 9 1996.".

Amend the title so as to read: "An Act to amend the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act to modify certain provisions relating to programs for individuals with developmental disabilities, Federal assistance for priority area activities for individuals with developmental disabilities, protection and advocacy of individual rights, university affiliated programs, and projects of national significance, and for other purposes.".
