A BILL

To provide that the Secretary of Commerce shall not set minimum or maximum amounts on grants made for the purpose of providing financial assistance to States whose tourism promotion needs have increased due to Hurricane Andrew, Hurricane Iniki, or other disasters.

7 other disasters, shall not establish or enforce a maximum

- 1 or a minimum dollar amount of assistance to be made
- 2 available to an individual or to a State.
