Mr. LAUTENBERG (for himself and Mr. BRADLEY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 2,2-dimethylcyclopropylcarboxamide.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. D-CARBOXAMIDE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.30.68 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/95”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by
9 this Act applies with respect to articles entered, or
10 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or

1 after the 15th day after the date of the enactment
2 of this Act.

3 (2) RELIQUIDATION.—Notwithstanding section
4 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
5 of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-
6 priate customs officer on or before the 90th day
7 after the date of the enactment of this Act, any
8 entry, or withdrawal from warehouse for consump-
9 tion, of an article described in subheading
10 9902.30.68 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
11 the United States that was made—

12 (A) after December 31, 1992, and

13 (B) before the date which is 15 days after
14 the date of the enactment of this Act,
15 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such
16 entry occurred on or after the date that is 15 days
17 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
