A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide that public ceremonies for the admission of new citizens shall be conducted solely in English.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT FOR**
4 **CEREMONIES FOR ADMISSION OF NEW CITI-**
5 **ZENS.**

6 (a) REQUIREMENT.—Section 337(d) of the Immigra-
7 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1448(d)) is amended
8 by adding at the end “All public ceremonies in which the

1 oath of allegiance is administered pursuant to this section
2 shall be conducted solely in the English language.”.

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
4 subsection (a) shall take effect 60 days after the date of
5 enactment of this Act.
