A BILL

To remove the United States arms embargo of the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. UNITED STATES ARMS EMBARGO OF THE GOV-**
4 **ERNMENT OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—Neither the President nor any
6 other member of the Executive Branch of the United

1 States Government shall interfere with the transfer of
2 arms to the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

3 (b) TERMINATION.—The President shall terminate
4 the United States arms embargo of the Government of
5 Bosnia and Herzegovina upon receipt from that govern-
6 ment of a request for assistance in exercising its right of
7 self-defense under Article 51 of the United Nations Char-
8 ter.

9 (c) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term
10 “United States arms embargo of the Government of
11 Bosnia and Herzegovina” means the application to the
12 Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina of—

13 (1) the policy adopted July 10, 1991, and pub-
14 lished in the Federal Register of July 19, 1991 (58
15 Fed. Reg. 33322), under the heading “Suspension of
16 Munitions Export Licenses to Yugoslavia”; and

17 (2) any similar policy being applied by the
18 United States Government as of the date of receipt
19 of the request described in subsection (a) pursuant
20 to which approval is routinely denied for transfers of
21 defense articles and defense services to the former
22 Yugoslavia.

23 (d) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as au-
24 thorization for deployment of United States forces in the
25 territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for any purpose, in-

1 cluding training, support or delivery of military equip-
2 ment.
