A BILL

To designate the United States courthouse that is scheduled to be constructed in Concord, New Hampshire, as the “Warren B. Rudman United States Courthouse”, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF WARREN B. RUDMAN UNITED**
2 **STATES COURTHOUSE.**

3 The United States courthouse that (as of the date
4 of enactment of this Act) is scheduled to be constructed
5 in Concord, New Hampshire, shall be known and des-
6 ignated as the “Warren B. Rudman United States Court-
7 house”.

8 **SEC. 2. LEGAL REFERENCES.**

9 Any reference in a law, regulation, document, record,
10 map, or other paper of the United States to the courthouse
11 referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference
12 to the “Warren B. Rudman United States Courthouse”.

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
