Mr. PACKWOOD (for himself, Mr. DANFORTH, and Mr. BAUCUS) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To exempt semiconductors from the country of origin marking requirements under the Tariff Act of 1930.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That section 304 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C.
4 1304) is amended—

5 (1) by striking “Except as hereinafter pro-
6 vided,” at the beginning of subsection (a) and in-
7 serting “Except as otherwise provided in this sec-
8 tion,”;

9 (2) by redesignating subsections (f), (g), and
10 (h) as subsections (g), (h), and (i), respectively; and

1 (3) by inserting after subsection (e) the follow-
2 ing new subsection:

3 “(f) EXEMPTION FROM MARKING FOR SEMICONDUCTOR-
4 TORS.—Articles provided for in headings 8541 and 8542
5 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States
6 and their containers are exempt from the marking require-
7 ments of subsection (a).”.

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
